A BILL FOR

1 An Act relating to trespass, and providing penalties.
2 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF IOWA:

1 Section 1. Section 716.7, subsection 1, Code 2026, is
2 amended by adding the following new paragraphs:

3 NEW PARAGRAPH. *0a.* "Immediate family member" means a
4 person's spouse, children, parents or guardians, siblings, and
5 grandparents, whether related by blood, adoption, or marriage.

6 NEW PARAGRAPH. *00a.* "Lawful authority" means the ability
7 of a person to produce a deed or mortgage statement in the
8 person's name, a lease agreement that includes the name and
9 signature of the property owner or an authorized representative
10 of the property owner, a valid written or electronic agreement
11 or communication authorizing the person to enter upon the
12 property, or a receipt or other reliable evidence of a
13 rent payment made to the property owner or an authorized
14 representative of the property owner dated within the last
15 sixty days.

16 NEW PARAGRAPH. *g.* "Squatting" means a person knowingly
17 taking up residence at a property not open to the public
18 without lawful authority.

19 Sec. 2. Section 716.7, subsection 2, paragraph a, Code 2026,
20 is amended by adding the following new subparagraph:

21 NEW SUBPARAGRAPH. (2A) Squatting, if all of the following
22 are true:

23 (a) The person is not a current tenant at the property.

24 (b) The person does not have a valid agreement to occupy
25 the property.

26 (c) The person is not an immediate family member of the
27 owner of the property.

28 (d) The person acts without lawful authority in entering and
29 residing on the property.

30 Sec. 3. Section 716.8, Code 2026, is amended by adding the
31 following new subsection:

32 NEW SUBSECTION. 9. *a.* A person committing a trespass
33 as provided in section 716.7, subsection 2, paragraph "a",
34 subparagraph (2A), commits the following:

35 (1) For a first offense, a serious misdemeanor.

1 (2) For a second offense, an aggravated misdemeanor.

2 (3) For a third or subsequent offense, a class "D" felony.

3 *b.* A person providing a false document in response to a
4 request to produce a document proving lawful authority is, in
5 addition to any other criminal offense, guilty of a fraudulent
6 practice under section 714.8.
