

## PHILIP E. BRAMMER

Mr. Speaker: Your committee appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character, and public service of the late honorable Philip E. Brammer, begs leave to submit the following Memorial:

Mr. Brammer was born on February 12, 1932, in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. He married Lorraine Riddell in 1995.

Mr. Brammer was a graduate of Franklin High School and attended the University of Iowa. He served in the Iowa House of Representatives for seven terms, beginning in 1983. He most recently retired as president of Benefits, Inc. He was a member of the Democratic Party and numerous anti-smoking organizations. He had two sons, Joe and Tom, three daughters, Vicky, Jeanne and Kathy, and a step-daughter, Ann.

Philip E. Brammer died on March 6, 1999, at St. Luke's Hospital.

DONOVAN W. BURINGTON

Mr. Speaker: Your committee, appointed to prepare a suitable resolution commemorating the life, character, and public service of the late Honorable Donovan W. Burington, begs leave to submit the following memorial:

Mr. Burington was born October 25, 1908 in Pocahontas, Iowa. He graduated from Spencer High School and the University of Iowa Law School. He practiced law in Sioux City until 1934, when at the age of 26, he was elected to the Iowa Legislature serving Woodbury County during the 46<sup>th</sup> General Assembly. Mr. Burington served two years as Assistant Attorney General for the state before returning to Spencer to practice law in the firm of Burington & Avery.

In 1937, he married Jeanne Tesdell. Don served 33 months in the U.S. Navy during World War II. In 1946, he joined the law firm of Westfall, Laird and Burington in Mason City. He served as president of the Cerro Gordo County Bar Association, the District Bar Association and the Iowa State Bar Association from 1969-1970.
