

Mr. Miller was born August 26, 1903. He married Ruth A. Peck of Olin, Iowa; they had three daughters.

Mr. Miller was educated in the Stanwood schools and the Cedar Rapids Business College. Roy and Ruth A. Peck were married June 23, 1927. He farmed near Onslow from 1927 until 1931. Mr. Miller operated farm equipment and motor truck stores for 30 years with dealerships in Earlville, Manchester, Ryan, Independence, and Monticello. He retired from the implement business in 1962. Roy was a member of the St. Luke's United Methodist Church of Monticello, the Burns Masonic Lodge, the El Kahir Shrine, the Acacia Chapter & Schreiner Chapter of the Order of the Eastern Star. He served nine years on the Monticello City Council, the Senior Housing Board, the Implement Dealers Association, and as President of the Residents Council at Methwick.

Mr. Miller was a member of the Republican Party and served as State Representative for three terms, the 60th, 62nd, and 63rd General Assemblies.

Roy Miller died on October 26, 1998, at the Methwick Retirement Community in Cedar Rapids. He is survived by his children, Marilyn of Monticello; Linda of Manchester; Carol of Arlington, Texas; and four grandchildren.

Mr. Mueller was born on July 6, 1906 in Worth County, Iowa. He married Marcella Bergland of Hettinger, North Dakota on January 2, 1931. They had five children, four boys and a girl.

Mr. Mueller attended Manly High School and graduated from Iowa State College in 1929 with a degree in economics. He began farming in 1933 and was active in many farm groups. He was a member of the Farmers Union, chaired the Worth County Agricultural Adjustment Administration and Production Marketing Association, served as secretary and president of the Worth County Farm Bureau, and was a county

committee member of the Farmers Home Administration. He served as director of the Worth County Cooperative Oil Company and Manly State Bank. Mr. Mueller served as treasurer of the Lincoln Township Schools. Other civic activities included the Theta Chi social fraternity, Elks Club, Izaak Walton League, Manly Community Club, and member of the Evangelical United Brethren Church.

Mr. Mueller was a member of the Democratic Party and served as State Representative for four terms, from 1959 to 1966.

Harold F. Mueller died on September 3, 1998 of heart failure. He is survived by his wife Marcella; and four children, Eugene of Manly; Ray of Evergreen, Colorado; Mary Griffith of Towson, Maryland; and Paul of Clive.

Mr. Shoning graduated from Danbury High School and received certificates of graduation from the International Business Men's School in Scanton, Pennsylvania and the American Business Men's School in Oak Park, Illinois. He served three years overseas in the Army during World War II. Mr. Shoning served as operations manager for Westinghouse Electric Supply Company.

Mr. Shoning served as a zoning administrator and civil service personnel director, and safety director for Woodbury County.
