- Appropriates \$62.8 million from the Healthy Iowans Tobacco Trust for various health-related appropriations. This is a decrease of \$2.4 million compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation. Also transfers \$2.0 million General Fund to the Medical Assistance (Medicaid) Program.
- Appropriates a total of \$39.6 million from the Healthy Iowans Tobacco Trust to the Department of Human Services. This is a decrease of \$5.3 million compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation.
  - \$8.1 million for health related noninstitutional providers. (Page 1, Line 9)
  - \$3.8 million for dental services. (Page 1, Line 20)
  - \$3.0 million for hospitals. (Page 1, Line 26)

**DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH**

- Appropriates \$19.1 million to the Department of Public Health. This is an increase of \$1.6 million compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation for the following:
  - \$5.0 million and 7.0 FTE positions for Tobacco Use Prevention and Control Initiatives. This is no change compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation and a decrease of 4.25 FTE positions. (Page 3, Line 18)
  - \$75,000 for smoking cessation products. This is no change compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation. (Page 4, Line 11)
  - \$11.8 million for substance abuse treatment programs. This is an increase of \$1.8 million compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation, but an increase of \$443 compared to total funding for FY 2003 when the carryover balance is considered. (Page 4, Line 20)
  - \$2.2 million and 4.0 FTE positions for the Healthy Iowans 2010 Plan. This is a decrease of \$190,064 compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation and no change in FTE positions. (Page 5, Line 10)

**DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS**

- Appropriates \$860,000 to four Judicial District Departments of Correctional Services and the Newton Correctional Facility. This is an increase of \$250,000 for a value-based treatment program at the Newton Correctional Facility. (Page 5, Line 34)
- Appropriates \$1.1 million and 17.9 FTE positions for a special needs unit at the Fort Madison Correctional Facility. This is no change compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation (Page 7, Line 13)

**PURCHASE OF SERVICE CONTRACT  
PROVIDERS**

- Appropriates \$147,000 to the Property Tax Relief Fund to assist counties with the costs associated with purchase of service contracts for provision of mental health services. (Page 6, Line 19)

**IOWA EMPOWERMENT FUNDING**

- Appropriates \$2.2 million for School Ready Grants for Iowa Empowerment. This is an increase of \$1.0 million compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation. (Page 6, Line 35)

**RISK POOL TRANSFER**

- Transfers \$2.0 million in General Fund moneys from the Risk Pool to the Medical Assistance (Medicaid) appropriation. (Page 7, Line 18)

**ENDOWMENT OF IOWA'S HEALTH

- Transfers \$4.6 million from the Endowment for Iowa's Health Account to the Healthy Iowans Tobacco Trust Fund for FY 2004. (Page 7, Line 27)

Healthy Iowans Tobacco Trust appropriation to the Department of Public Health for smoking cessation products.

DETAIL: Maintains current level of funding.

 4 16 (c)(3) to fund the provision of smoking cessation products to  
 4 17 patients. The department shall adopt a methodology for the

Specifies the process for the Department of Public Health to undertake for the grant awards for the smoking cessation products funding. Specifies that certain free health clinics are the possible grantees.

DETAIL: This is an increase of \$1,800,000 compared to the FY 2003 estimated net appropriation. This program received \$1,799,557 from a one-time carryforward balance in FY 2003. As a result, in total funding, this is an increase of \$443 compared to the FY 2003 level of funding.

Requires the Department of Public Health to use the funds appropriated in this paragraph to expand the length of individual client substance abuse treatment plans.

 4 32 paragraph "c" to share research-based best practices for  
 4 33 treatment with substance abuse treatment facilities.

Requires the Department of Public Health to use the funds appropriated in this paragraph to share research-based best practices for treatment.

4 34 (4) The department shall use funds appropriated in this  
 4 35 paragraph "c" to develop a results-based funding approach for  
 5 1 substance abuse treatment services.

Requires the Department of Public Health to use the funds appropriated in this paragraph to develop a results-based funding approach for substance abuse treatment services.

 5 3 paragraph "c" to develop a program to encourage individuals  
 5 4 who are successfully managing their substance abuse problems

10 12 for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June  
10 13 30, 2004, for assistance to counties with limited county  
10 14 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental  
10 15 disabilities services fund balances to pay reimbursement  
10 16 increases in the same amount as provided in the fiscal year  
10 17 beginning July 1, 2000, and ending June 30, 2001.

10 18 The bill appropriates funds from the healthy lowans tobacco  
10 19 trust to the Iowa empowerment fund for the fiscal year  
10 20 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004, for deposit  
10 21 in the school ready children grants account.

10 22 The bill appropriates funds to the department of  
10 23 corrections from the healthy lowans tobacco trust for  
10 24 operation and staffing of a special needs unit at the Fort  
10 25 Madison correctional facility.

10 26 The bill transfers moneys appropriated for the county  
10 27 mental health, mental retardation, and developmental  
10 28 disabilities allowed growth factor adjustment for the risk  
10 29 pool for fiscal year 2003-2004 to the medical assistance  
10 30 appropriation.

10 31 The bill also transfers additional moneys from the  
10 32 endowment for Iowa's health account to the healthy lowans  
10 33 tobacco trust for fiscal year 2003-2004.
