Total General Fund Appropriations in HF 807:	\$120,443,946	\$120,543,946	\$ -100,000	House strikes \$100,000 for the youth enrichment pilot project and eliminates the Senate strike of \$600,000 in contingent Microsoft funds.

Major Funding and Language Differences:

- House strikes the Senate strike of the \$600,000 contingent FY 2005 supplemental from Microsoft settlement funds for technology. This
 action retains the language in the Bill as passed by the House.
- House eliminates \$100,000 for a youth enrichment pilot project. The pilot project would have provided a grant to establish mentoring
 programs for offenders between the ages of 16 to 22 that have been charged with a felony that reside in a county with a population that
 exceeds 300,000.

Items of Agreement in Separate Bills:

- Increases the number of appropriated magistrates from 191 to 206, an increase of 15. Also, increases the Judicial Branch appropriation by \$320,000 to help offset the costs of the additional magistrates. The House and Senate agree, but the House approved this language in HF 882 (Standing Appropriations) and the Senate incorporated this language in HF 807.
- Allows pre-sentence investigation reports to be electronically mailed to county attorneys. The House and Senate agree, but the House approved this language in HF 882 (Standing Appropriations Bill) and the Senate incorporated this language in HF 807.
- Eliminates the requirement that clerks of district court re-send notices by mail unless they receive an updated mailing address. The House and Senate agree, but the House approved this language in HF 882 (Standing Appropriations Bill) and the Senate incorporated this language in HF 807.
- Specifies it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Supreme Court study tribal court issues. The House and Senate agree, but the House approved this language in HF 882 (Standing Appropriations Bill) and the Senate incorporated this language in HF 807.
- Specifies that the Supreme Court may adopt rules to allow additional compensation for jurors whose attendance and services exceed seven days.
