- If federal funds received exceed the amount appropriated, the excess is to be prorated with the exception of the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program and the Community Services Block Grants. (Page 16, Line 7)

### FEDERAL AND NONSTATE FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS

 Provides the mechanism for agencies to receive additional federal and nonstate funds to the extent necessary. Requires notification of the Legislative Fiscal Committee if funds become available to permit the Committee to comment on the expenditure of funds. (Page 16, Line 31)
