Appropriates a total of \$19.8 million from the General Fund to the Departments of Human Services, Corrections, and Public Safety. Office of the State Public Defender, and Department of Education for FY 2003.

FISCAL IMPACT: For the last several years, housing federal detainees in Iowa prisons has generated approximately \$3,350,000. The fiscal impact of this language is anticipated to be less than \$200,000. The Department anticipates spending any additional revenue at the Fort Dodge and Newton Correctional Facilities to partially offset the furlough reductions.
