Major Language Differences:

• Senate:

- Provides that eligibility for the Medicaid expansion population benefits is dependent on the individual not being eligible for the Medical Assistance Program in effect on "or after" April 1, 2005.
- Adds that the health risk assessment is part of the criteria developed for cultural variations.
- Adds that a rural health clinic may be a contracted provider for purposes of the individual's medical examination and personal health improvement plan.
- Lengthens from 10 days to 20 days, the requirement for providers for the expansion population network to submit claims for services.
- Strikes the criteria regarding the 300 children served via a mental health waiver for behavioral care services and adds a reference to a possible statutory change related to the same subject.
- Strikes and replaces language relating to Case Management for the Frail Elderly. Additional consultation with the Department of Elder Affairs is required, the State savings from Case Management are required to be for services and the Substitute Decision-Making Services, if enacted.
- Requires the Department of Human Services to collaborate with the Department of Public Health regarding the Smoking Cessation Program for the Medical Assistance population.
- Adds language that the 12 monthly installments used to pay the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, Broadlawns Hospital, and the four Mental Health Institutes are based on the amount specified for each entity.
- Requires that the Chapter 28E, <u>Code of Iowa</u>, agreements between the Department of Human Services and Broadlawns Hospital, and between the Department and the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics include exceptions to the 20-day claim submittal deadline and data reporting requirements.
- Specifies that the annual transfer of \$34.0 million from Polk County to the lowacare Account may be reduced by an amount dependent upon the federal matching funds requirement.

SENATE/HOUSE COMPARISONHOUSE FILE 841 AS AMENDED BY THE SENATEEXECUTIVE SUMMARY OF MAJOR DIFFERENCESIOWACARE MEDICAID REFORM

- Increases the amount allocated from the \$40.0 million appropriation from the Iowa Care Account to Broadlawns Hospital for the 12-month distribution from \$36.0 million to \$37.0 million of the \$40.0 million.
- Tiers the financial participation and monthly premium cost for the expansion population dependent upon family income. If less than 100.0% of the Federal Poverty Level, the premium would not exceed 1/12 of 2.0% of the member's family income. If greater than 100.0% of the Federal Poverty Level, the premium would be 1/12 of 5.0% of the member's annual family income.
- Requires the Department of Human Services to waive required out-of-pocket expenditures based upon hardship.
- Requires the Department of Human Services to track the out-of-pocket expenditures for patient enrollment and administrative costs and report the findings to the Medical Assistance Projections and Assessment Council.
