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HOUSE FILE 2527 AS AMENDED BY THE SENATE EDUCATION APPROPRIATIONS BILL

SENATE AMENDMENT

FUNDING CHANGES

- The Bill as amended by the Senate appropriates a total of \$887.0 million from the General Fund and 12,887.4 FTE positions to the Department for the Blind, the College Student Aid Commission, the Department of Cultural Affairs, the Department of Education, and the Board of Regents. This is an increase of \$25.4 million and 6.0 FTE positions compared to the estimated FY 2006 General Fund appropriations.
- The Bill makes the following funding changes when compared to House Action:

· College Student Aid Commission:

- \$115,000 decrease for the Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program.
- \$200,000 decrease for the State of Iowa Scholar Program.

· Department of Cultural Affairs:

• \$100,000 increase for the Great Places initiative.

. Department of Education:

- \$255,000 increase for the Vocational Rehabilitation Division to match federal funds.
- \$110,000 increase for Iowa Public Television for operational costs related to digital television programming.
- \$250,000 increase for a direct instruction pilot project.
- \$44,000 increase for parent liaisons.
- \$270,000 increase to develop model core curriculum.
- \$200,000 increase for Jobs for America's Grads.
- \$4.0 million increase for general aid to community colleges.

. Board of Regents:

- \$5.0 million increase to the Board of Regents for distribution to the universities for the Transformation Plan.
- \$352,000 increase for the Iowa School for the Deaf.
- \$197,000 increase for the Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School.

HOUSE FILE 2527 AS AMENDED BY THE SENATE EDUCATION APPROPRIATIONS BILL

LANGUAGE CHANGES

BILL AS PASSED BY THE HOUSE FUNDING SUMMARY

MAJOR INCREASES, DECREASES, AND TRANSFERS OF EXISTING PROGRAMS

- The Bill makes the following significant language changes:
 - Adds language that allocates \$250,000 of the new funds appropriated to the Board of Regents for a
 Consider Iowa Pilot Program. The Program is to research and design innovative methods to retain
 Iowa's college graduates. A progress report is to be submitted to the General Assembly by January
 15, 2007, and a final report with recommendations is due January 14, 2008.
 - Adds language that establishes a Reading Instruction Pilot Project Grant Program.

Page and line numbers refer to the Bill as originally passed by the House (pink copy).

- Appropriates a total of \$948.4 million from the General Fund and 12,870.4 FTE positions to the
 Department for the Blind, the College Student Aid Commission, the Department of Cultural Affairs, the
 Department of Education, and the Board of Regents. This is an increase of \$17.2 million and 2.0 FTE
 positions compared to the estimated FY 2006 General Fund appropriations.
- Makes the following General Fund increases or decreases for FY 2007:

· College Student Aid Commission:

- \$50,000 increase for the Osteopathic Forgivable Loan Program. (Page 1, Line 28)
- \$115,000 increase for the Teacher Shortage Forgivable Loan Program. (Page 2, Line 10)
- \$200,000 increase for a new appropriation for the State of Iowa Scholarship Program. This Program did not receive an appropriation in FY 2006, but in FY 2005 and prior years, the Program received a standing appropriation of \$465,000. The Bill requires the General Fund appropriation to be matched with an allocation of \$200,000 from the Commission's Scholarship and Grant Reserve Fund making total funds of \$400,000 available for this Program. (Page 2, Line 14)
- \$2.0 million net increase to the Tuition Grant Program. The appropriation is separated into two budget line lines, with a \$46.5 million appropriation for nonprofit schools and a \$5.2 million appropriation to proprietary (for profit) schools. (Page 27, Line 3 and Page 27, Line 28)

• Department of Cultural Affairs:

• \$25,000 decrease to eliminate the appropriation for Nonprofit Music Grants. This was a new appropriation in FY 2006.

STUDIES AND INTENT LANGUAGE

• Department of Education:

- \$260,000 increase and an additional 2.0 FTE positions to Iowa Public Television to operate digital transmitters. (Page 7, Line 13)
- \$2.5 million increase for the Student Achievement and Teacher Quality Program to maintain the minimum salaries. (Page 10, Line 15)
- \$50,000 increase for Vocational Agriculture Youth Organization. This is a new appropriation for FY 2007 for the Future Farmers of America (FFA) Foundation. (Page 10, Line 26)
- \$6.0 million increase for Community College General Aid. (Page 11, Line 1)

. Board of Regents:

- \$6.0 million increase to the Board Office for distribution to institutions as outlined in the Board's Transformation Plan. (Page 16, Line 15)
- Requires the community colleges to submit data regarding FY 2007 dual enrollment of high school students to the Chairpersons and Ranking Members of the Education Appropriations Subcommittee and the Legislative Services Agency (LSA) by October 1, 2007. (Page 11, Line 23)
- Requires the Department of Education, in collaboration with the community colleges and Regents' institutions, to study the development and collection of summary data on the academic performance of high school graduates who pursue post-secondary educational opportunities. A report of the Department's findings and a recommended implementation timeline are due to the Chairpersons and Ranking Members of the Joint Education Appropriations Subcommittee by January 1, 2007. (Page 12, Line 15)
- Requires the Department of Education to work with the Board of Regents and others to seek federal funding for the establishment and operation of a Teacher Intern Program. A progress report is due to the Chairpersons and Ranking Members of the Joint Education Appropriations Subcommittee by January 1, 2007. (Page 13, Line 8)
- Prohibits the Board of Regents from closing the Iowa Braille and Sight Saving School or merging it with another institution until certain conditions have been met. (Page 15, Line 20)
- Requires the departments within the Education Appropriations Subcommittee to review their short-term use of vehicles, revise their policies on short-term use to maximize cost savings, and submit reports to the Government Oversight Committees. (Page 23, Line 24)

HOUSE FILE 2527 AS AMENDED BY THE SENATE EDUCATION APPROPRIATIONS BILL

SIGNIFICANT CHANGES TO THE CODE OF IOWA

- Maintains the FY 2007 minimum teacher salaries required by the Student Achievement and Teacher Quality Program at the salary levels paid in FY 2002. (Page 13, Line 17)
- Codifies language related to State funding under the Enrich Iowa Program. (Page 24, Line 7)
- Requires the community colleges to submit annually, specified data regarding the enrollment of high school students in community college courses under the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options Act (PSEO) and through shared supplementary weighting plans. (Page 26, Line 1)
- Permits the Board of Educational Examiners to retain 75.0% of licensure fee revenue annually and to carry forward funds remaining at the end of each fiscal year. (Page 29, Line 3)
- Specifies that Section 16 of this Bill, requiring community colleges to report dual enrollment data to the Department of Education, takes effect on July 1, 2008. (Page 36, Line 1)
- Specifies that Section 28 of this Bill, a technical correction pertaining to the Student Achievement and Teacher Quality Program, takes effect upon enactment and applies retroactively to FY 2006. (Page 36, Line 15)
