## SENATE FILE 562 ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT APPROPRIATIONS BILL

FUNDING SUMMARY	• Appropriates a total of \$40.1 million from the General Fund and 499.9 FTE positions to the Department of Cultural Affairs, the Department of Economic Development, the Iowa Finance Authority, Board of Regents economic development programs, Iowa Workforce Development, and the Public Employment Relations Board (PERB). This is an increase of \$3.2 million and 15.2 FTE positions compared to the estimated FY 2007 appropriations. This Bill also increases support from other funds by \$1.5 million to a total of \$10.5 million.
