HOUSE APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE AMENDMENT H-1826 BILL AS PASSED BY THE SENATE	• Technical change to the title page. Adds the words "and including an effective date provision" after the word project.
PHARMACEUTICAL DISPOSAL PROGRAM	• Allocates \$225,000 from the Solid Waste Alternatives Program (SWAP) Account in the Groundwater Protection Fund to a designated agency to complete a one-year pilot project. The project will demonstrate the proper way to manage and dispose of unused, excessive, old, or seized pharmaceuticals.
	• Specifies the agency will be selected by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) and will meet the following criteria:
	• Is currently a household hazardous waste regional collection center.
	Serves a minimum of fifteen counties.
	• Is licensed as a reverse distributor by the Board of Pharmacy Examiners.
	• Is endorsed by the Governor's Office of Drug Control Policy.
FISCAL IMPACT	• The balance of the SWAP Account as of April 4, 2007, was \$1.2 million. However, the DNR reported there are signed SWAP contracts totaling \$1.4 million and unsigned SWAP contracts totaling \$558,000. The SWAP Account receives revenue of approximately \$2.0 million per year.
