HOUSE FILE 2775 AS AMENDED BY S-5197 MISCELLANEOUS COURT FEE BILL

- Permits elimination of the \$30 court cost for dismissal of a charge of failure to have proof of insurance. In FY 2005, there were 47,867 people charged with failure to have proof of insurance at the time of a stop. Of this amount, 24,675 people were convicted and 23,192 people had the charges dismissed. The fiscal impact is a reduction of \$695,760 in General Fund revenue for FY 2007 and future years.
- In FY 2005, hospitals filed 1,693 liens. Senate File 2320 (Filing Fees in District Court Act), enacted in the 2002 Legislative Session, increased the filing fee for liens from \$10 to \$20; however, hospital liens were not included in this legislation. This Bill makes all lien filing fees the same amount.
- Increases the current amount charged to mail an original notice in a small claims case from \$8 to \$10. The cost to mail a notice is paid up front as part of the court costs. The \$2 increase would cover the Judicial Branch's average postage costs per case. Attorneys and certain litigants would still have the option of receiving notice by a process server rather than the Judicial Branch, if they so choose.
- Creates a \$50 filing fee for filing and docketing a transcript of the judgment in a civil case.
- The \$10 increase for hospital lien filing fees results in approximately \$17,000 of additional revenue to the State General Fund. The change in the mailing fee for small claims is revenue neutral. The revenue impact of the \$50 filing and docketing fee for a transcript of the judgment in a civil case cannot be determined; however, it is expected to be minimal.
