Senate/House Difference Comparison

NOTE: Both the House and the Senate include funding for FY 2017 at approximately 50.00% of their FY 2016 appropriation levels for General Fund and Other Fund appropriations. The Senate's authorized FTE positions are the same for both fiscal years. The House's authorized FTE positions are the same for both fiscal years, with the exception of the Iowa State Commission on Volunteer Services that has been reduced by 0.15 FTE position by the House for FY 2017 compared to FY 2016.

Senate/House Difference Comparison

Language Differences:

- **Department of Cultural Affairs (DCA) – Arts Division - Film Office Allocation:** The Senate requires the allocation of \$300,000 for the operation of a Film Office within the DCA Arts Division General Fund appropriation. The House requires \$200,000, along with reducing the appropriation to the Arts Division by \$100,000.
- **Iowa Economic Development Authority (IEDA) Appropriation:** The Senate requires the IEDA to transfer \$100,000 from the IEDA operations General Fund appropriation to the Department of Transportation (DOT) for deposit in the Iowa Employment Rides Fund created in [SF 499](#) (Economic Development Appropriations Bill). The House does not require the transfer and does not establish the Fund.
- **The IEDA Iowa Commission on Volunteer Services (ICVS):** The Senate allocates \$125,000 for the Iowa Commission on Volunteer Service Grant Program from the General Fund, along with a \$50,000 increase for the ICVS appropriation. The House allocates \$75,000 and does not increase the appropriation.
- **The IEDA Iowa Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Internships:** The Senate specifies that the IEDA may use no more than \$30,000 of a General Fund STEM appropriation for administration costs related to the internships and requires nonreversion of funds appropriated to the IEDA for STEM from the General Fund. The House does not make a STEM appropriation.
- **The IEDA – Insurance Economic Development:** The Senate specifies that of the funds collected by the Insurance Division of the Department of Commerce in excess of the anticipated gross revenues, \$200,000 is allocated to the IEDA for insurance economic development purposes. The House allocates the same as FY 2015, \$100,000.
- **Department of Workforce Development (IWD) – Labor Services Division:** The Senate requires the Labor Services Division to allocate \$175,000 of the Division’s General Fund appropriation to hire additional investigators and support staff for wage enforcement, along with increasing the appropriation by \$175,000 for this purpose. The House does not provide additional funding and does not specify this requirement.
- **The IWD – Field Office Operations:** The Senate requires the IWD to allocate at least \$1.1 million of a General Fund appropriation for operation of four satellite field offices projected to serve the most people from the offices located in Decorah, Fort Madison, Iowa City, and Webster City. The House does not continue this FY 2015 requirement and makes a corresponding language change for the Unemployment Compensation Reserve Fund interest appropriation to the IWD for operation of the Field Offices.
- **Iowa Products:** The Senate requires all entities receiving an appropriation in this Bill to give first preference to purchasing an Iowa product or a product produced from an Iowa-based business and second preference to a U.S. product or a product produced from a business based in the U.S. The House does not continue this FY 2015 requirement.
- **Personnel Settlement Agreement Payments:** The Senate prohibits the DCA, IEDA, Iowa Finance Authority (IFA), Public Employment Relations Board (PERB), IWD, Board of Regents (BOR), and the BOR universities from using any funds for payment of a personnel settlement agreement with a State employee that contains a confidentiality agreement. The House does not continue this FY 2015 requirement.

Senate/House Difference Comparison

- **Veteran-Owned Businesses:** The Senate does not make the Iowa Code changes made by the House related to veteran-owned businesses.
- **Merit System Status and Appeals:** The Senate makes Iowa Code changes related to the merit system and employees and the House does not.
- **Redevelopment Tax Credits:** The Senate makes Iowa Code changes related to Redevelopment Tax Credits and the House does not.
- **Franchise Agreements:** The Senate amends a franchisor's ability to require a franchisee to obtain supplies from the franchisor by creating a specific exemption for motor oil that is labeled in accordance with the requirements of the American Petroleum Institute and the House does not.
- **Reinvestment Districts and Flood Mitigation:** The Senate modifies provisions related to reinvestment districts under Iowa Code chapter [15J](#) and to flood mitigation projects under Iowa Code chapter [418](#) and the House does not.
- **Nuisance Properties and Abandoned Buildings:** The Senate modifies provisions and establishes a Nuisance Property Remediation Assistance Fund and Program relating to nuisance property and abandoned buildings and the House does not.
