**FUNDING SUMMARY**

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- Appropriates a total of \$34.5 million from the General Fund and 1,562.0 FTE positions for FY 2013. This is an increase of \$2.2 million and 73.1 FTE positions compared to estimated FY 2012. Appropriates \$77.5 million from other funds. This is no change compared to estimated FY 2012. Page 1, Line 5

NOTE: Total funding for FY 2013 includes the previously enacted appropriations for FY 2013 and new appropriation amounts proposed in this Bill.
