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FUNDING SUMMARY

• Appropriates a total of \$35.7 million from the General Fund and 1,567.0 FTE positions for FY 2013. This is an increase of \$3.4 million and 78.1 FTE positions compared to estimated FY 2012. Appropriates \$67.5 million from other funds. This is an increase of \$2.0 million compared to estimated FY 2012.

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NOTE: Total funding for FY 2013 includes the previously enacted appropriations for FY 2013 and new appropriation amounts proposed in this Bill.

MAJOR INCREASES, DECREASES, OR TRANSFERS OF EXISTING PROGRAMS

Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship (DALS) - General Fund

- An increase of \$352,500 for administrative expenditures in the Soil Conservation Division.
- An increase of \$950,000 for expenditures related to salary increases and related costs.
- An increase of \$110,000 and 2.00 FTE positions Soil Conservation Technicians.
- An increase of \$118,000 and 2.00 FTE positions for Gas Pump Inspectors.
- An increase of \$105,000 and 1.00 FTE position for a State Veterinarian.
- Appropriates \$75,000 from the General Fund for the Local Food and Farm Program. In FY 2012, this was funded from the Environment First Fund (EFF).
- Appropriates \$25,000 from the General Fund for the Iowa Future Farmers of America. In FY 2012, this was funded from the EFF.

Department of Natural Resources (DNR) - General Fund

- A decrease of \$434,000 and an increase of 33.00 FTE positions for operations.
- Appropriates \$1.8 million from the General Fund for the Floodplain Safety and Dam Management Program. In FY 2012, this Program was funded with \$2.0 million from the Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund (RIIF).
- Appropriates \$100,000 from the General Fund for the Forestry Health Management Program. In FY 2012, this Program was funded from the EFF.
- Appropriates \$200,000 for the Geological and Water Survey Program. In FY 2012, this Program was funded from the EFF.

• Environment First Fund appropriations to the DALS for FY 2013. Changes include:

- An increase of \$700,000 for Soil Conservation Cost Share.
- An increase of \$200,000 for the Loess Hills Conservation Program.
- Appropriates \$1.3 million from the EFF for the Agriculture Drainage Wells Program.
- Appropriates \$250,000 for the Southern Iowa Conservation Authority.

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AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES APPROPRIATIONS BILL

- Moves the Local Food and Farm Program and the Iowa FFA appropriations to the General Fund.
- Environment First Fund appropriations to the DNR for FY 2013. Changes include: moving the Forestry Health Management and the Geological and Water Survey Program appropriations to the General Fund.

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SIGNIFICANT CODE CHANGES

• Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship

- Requires nonreversion of the Dairy Survey Program appropriation.
- Requires nonreversion of the Local Food and Farm Program appropriation.
- Requires nonreversion of the Iowa FFA appropriation.
- Requires nonreversion of the Farmers With Disabilities appropriation.

Department of Natural Resources

- Permits the DNR to use unappropriated funds in the Fish and Game Protection Fund to provide compensation to retiring conservation officers. This includes payment of insurance premiums and unused sick leave.
- Permits the DNR to use unappropriated funds from the Fish and Game Protection Fund for FY 2013 salary increases.

Resource Enhancement and Protection (REAP):

- If the total allocated to the Open Spaces Account is greater than \$4,200,000 for FY 2013, the Director of the DNR can use funds for State Park maintenance and operations. The Open Spaces account is funded from a formula in the Iowa Code for the REAP Fund.
- If the total allocated to the Soil and Water Enhancement Account is greater than \$3,000,000 for FY 2013, the Secretary of Agriculture can use funds for urban conservation practices. The Soil and Water Enhancement Account is funded from a formula in the Iowa Code for the REAP Fund.
