Section 1. 2013 Iowa Acts, chapter 133, section 7, is 1 1 2 amended to read as follows: 1 SEC. 7. JUDICIAL BRANCH. 1 3 1. There is appropriated from the general fund of the state 1 4 5 to the judicial branch for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1 6 2014, and ending June 30, 2015, the following amount, or so 1 7 much thereof as is necessary, to be used for the purposes 1 8 designated: 1 a. For salaries of supreme court justices, appellate court 1 9 judges, district court judges, district associate judges, 1 10 1 11 associate juvenile judges, associate probate judges, judicial 1 12 magistrates and staff, state court administrator, clerk of the 1 13 supreme court, district court administrators, clerks of the 1 14 district court, juvenile court officers, board of law examiners 1 15 and board of examiners of shorthand reporters and judicial 1 16 gualifications commission; receipt and disbursement of child 1 17 support payments; reimbursement of the auditor of state for 1 18 expenses incurred in completing audits of the offices of the 1 19 clerks of the district court during the fiscal year beginning 1 20 July 1, 2014; and maintenance, equipment, and miscellaneous 1 21 purposes: 1 22 <del>.....\$ 82,299,684</del> 1 23 171,486,612 b. For deposit in the revolving fund created pursuant 1 24 to section 602.1302, subsection 3, for jury and witness 1 25 1 26 fees, mileage, costs related to summoning jurors, fees for interpreters, and reimbursement of attorney fees paid by the 1 27 1 28 state public defender: 1 29 1.550.000 <del>.....\$</del> 1 30 3,100,000 2. The judicial branch, except for purposes of internal 1 31 32 processing, shall use the current state budget system, the 1 1 33 state payroll system, and the lowa finance and accounting 34 system in administration of programs and payments for services, 1 35 and shall not duplicate the state payroll, accounting, and 1 1 budgeting systems. 2 2 3. The judicial branch shall submit monthly financial 2 3 statements to the legislative services agency and the 2 4 department of management containing all appropriated accounts 2 5 in the same manner as provided in the monthly financial status 2 6 reports and personal services usage reports of the department 2 7 of administrative services. The monthly financial statements 2 8 shall include a comparison of the dollars and percentage 2

General Fund appropriation to the Judicial Branch for operations.

DETAIL: This is an increase of \$5,899,865 compared to estimated FY 2014 to be used to maintain current operations and to add an additional 29.00 FTE positions.

General Fund appropriation to the Jury and Witness Fee Revolving Fund for the reimbursement of juror and witness fees, mileage, and costs.

DETAIL: This is no change compared to estimated FY 2014.

Prohibits the Judicial Branch from duplicating current State payroll, budgeting, and accounting systems, except for the implementation of an internal accounting and recordkeeping system.

Requires the Judicial Branch to submit monthly financial statements for all appropriated accounts to the Fiscal Services Division of the Legislative Services Agency (LSA) and the Department of Management (DOM). Specifies what is to be included in the financial statements. 2 9 spent of budgeted versus actual revenues and expenditures on

2 10 a cumulative basis for full-time equivalent positions and

2 11 dollars.

Requires the Judicial Branch to focus efforts on collecting delinquent fines and fees.

Specifies it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Judicial Branch operate Clerk of Court offices in all 99 counties and be open to the public as much as reasonably possible.

Requires the Judicial Branch to notify the LSA prior to any intradepartmental transfer of funds and specifies the contents of the notice.

Requires the Judicial Branch to provide a semiannual report to the LSA specifying the amount of fines, surcharges, and court costs collected using the Iowa Court Information System (ICIS). Requires the Judicial Branch to continue to share vital sentencing and other information with departments and government agencies involved with the criminal justice system through the ICIS.

Requires the Judicial Branch to report to the General Assembly by January 1, 2015, regarding the revenues and expenditures of the Enhanced Court Collections Fund and the Court Technology and Modernization Fund for FY 2014 and planned expenditures for FY 2015. The Judicial Branch is required to provide a copy of this report to the LSA.

Specifies it is the intent of the General Assembly that the Judicial Branch focus on the expansion of family treatment courts on a statewide basis.
