

The parks are created for four purposes: first, recreational; second, scientific; third, historical; fourth, scenic. Donations have been made by public spirited citizens as at Ft. Defiance, Eldora-Pine Creek, Lacey-Keosauqua, Lepley, Pilot Knob, Ledges, Dolliver Memorial, Farmington, Oak Grove, King, Wild Cat Den, Ambrose A. Call, Bixby, Bellevue, Barkley Preserve, T. F. Clark, Clear Lake, Elbert Tract, Flint Hills, Lost Island, Oakland Mills, Okamanpedan, Palisades-Keppler, Pammel, Pilot Knob, Rice Lake, Storm Lake, Wall Lake, Waubonsie, Wapispinicon, Wood Thrush Preserve, Woodman Hollow Preserve.

Under act of the forty-fourth general assembly, the board of conservation and the fish and game commission, with a joint fund of \$25,000, are instructed to recommend within two years a state-wide twenty-five year program for state parks, fish hatcheries and recreational areas.

Pharmacy examiners receive \$10 daily, with a maximum of \$1,200 each per year.

Members of the board are appointed for a term of three years, one member each year. All persons who shall desire to conduct the business of selling at retail, compounding or dispensing drugs, etc., for medical use, must be registered pharmacists and their names registered in a book kept by the board for that purpose, showing also their residence, together with the date of issuing their certificate. Fee examination and certificate, \$10.00. The license fee for itinerant vendor of drugs is \$100 a year. The *penalty* for selling without a vendor license is \$10 to \$100.

The state board for vocational education was established by the thirty-seventh general assembly in the act accepting the terms of the federal law on vocational education commonly known as the Smith-Hughes Act.

The membership of the board is ex-officio. The board co-operates with public schools in formation of day classes in agriculture, trade and industries, and home-making. Also in each of these lines part-time and evening classes are conducted by public schools working with the board.

In all cases mentioned above the districts receive reimbursement on teachers' salaries from federal funds alone.

The board also co-operates with the proper authorities at Iowa State College at Ames in preparing teachers of the above subjects.

The thirty-ninth general assembly approved the federal law of June 2, 1920, called the industrial rehabilitation act, for operation in Iowa. By the federal law the state board for vocational education became the board for conducting rehabilitation for all eligible disabled cases excepting those coming directly under the federal government for persons disabled as a result of enlisted service in army and navy.

STATE FISH AND GAME COMMISSION

Appointed by the Governor, approved by the senate. Serve without salary, expenses paid while on duty. Terms of three first in following list expire May 1, 1935, and of the two last May 1, 1933: J. N. Darling, Des Moines; Dennis H. Geeders, Algona; Dr. W. C. Boone, Ottumwa; Dr. J. F. Walter, McGregor; Arthur E. Rapp, Council Bluffs. State Game Warden, W. E. Albert, Lansing, salary \$3,300 per annum.

The forty-fourth general assembly created the state fish and game commission to take over the work heretofore done by the state fish and game department. The commission was also given power to acquire areas in which persons may hunt, fish and trap.

The members of the board receive as compensation \$10 per diem for the time actually employed and necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties. Under the provisions of the law the board meets at least once annually to examine persons desiring to practice in Iowa as certified public accountants and issue certificates to those qualifying. The examination fee is \$25.00. Persons granted a certificate to practice must furnish bond to the auditor of state in the sum of \$5,000.
