REPORT OF THE COMPUTER USER POLICY DIRECTION COMMITTEE

The Computer User Policy Direction Committee met on August 1 and 26, September 23, and October 1 and 14, 1991, and makes the following report:

A. The Committee recommends adoption of a policy for Executive Branch public access to the Legislative Information System during the 1992 Legislative Session (for information electronically stored in the mainframe computer). The recommended policy is attached and by this reference made a part of this report.

B. The Committee reports that the following policies have been developed concerning services provided to legislative users by the Computer Support Bureau and are on file with the Legislative Service Bureau:

- 1. A Legislative Staff Training Policy (for training provided by the Computer Support Bureau).
- 2. A Computer Support Policy (for hardware and software support provided by the Computer Support Bureau to users of legislative computers).

B. The Committee, as the designated steering committee under the Unisys systems services contract, reports that 71.5 hours of services of the item 1 service hours have been utilized to date.

C. The Committee is studying and monitoring the following issues:

- 1. Implementation of new Mapper levels on the mainframe computer.
- 2. Surveys of computer needs
- 3. Implementation of the network links between the legislative and executive branch computer systems.
- 4. Executive branch proposals involving computers.
- 5. Development of additional computer applications involving in-house support as well as assistance from outside vendors such as Unisys.

- 1. For the 1992 Session only, up to 25 Executive Branch Users would be granted access to the Legislative Information System.
- 2. The cost for the 1992 Session Access would be as follows:

*Basic Subscription Service	\$300.00
Code Search & Retrieval	\$200.00

3. The Legislative Information System by Executive Branch Agencies shall be granted in such a manner that the quality of service available to legislative users is not reduced. The Director of the Computer Support Bureau may limit or interrupt access to the Legislative Information System by Executive Branch Agencies if the quality of service available to legislative users is reduced or impaired.
