

SUBJECT: ICON – Status Report

The ICON system has improved dramatically during the last year. Among the improvements are:

1. Four system enhancement rollouts have improved end user efficiency
2. Ad-hoc reporting has been implemented
3. Intervention group statistics available to DOC staff. Examples include: batterer's, drug court, sex offender, TASC (Treatment Alternatives to Street Crimes), and day programming
4. Started planning for ICON-Mercury for institution staff
5. Started planning and code writing for ICON-Medical
6. Majority of staff using computer generated PSI
7. Time spent entering ICON data has been reduced
8. Data sharing with CJJP data warehouse and courts
9. Pilot project underway with Polk County Attorney
10. Expanded ICON access to Child Support Recovering, Ombudsman, and Sex Offender Registry
