## Unemployment Insurance Training Extension Benefits

In March, Governor Culver signed a monumental Unemployment Insurance Modernization Bill. A component of the legislation provides individuals receiving unemployment insurance with the opportunity to receive an additional 26 weeks of benefits while they are enrolled in a department approved training program that leads to a career in a high-demand/high-growth occupation.

While the program only went into effect on July $5^{\text {th }}$, there is great interest in the program and we continue to monitor usage very carefully. In the first three months we paid $\$ 1,257,695$ total in training extension benefits. The breakdown of the applications is as follows:

Through the first two months of the program, the success of the program can be further measured by gender being nearly equal and $19.5 \%$ are indicating their ethnicity as being non-white. However, these numbers are not reliable as individuals on training extension benefits voluntarily report their ethnicity.
