Dear Ms. Madison:

Pursuant to your request, I am enclosing a listing of community colleges and their fall-term credit enrollment for 2001 depicted as a percentage change vis-à-vis each colleges fall term enrollments for 2000. Exact numerical head counts will be available at a later date as included in the Management Information System at the Department of Education. Based on the percentage increases reported by our community colleges, it is estimated that total credit enrollments will approach 70,000 for the first time in our history. As you know, in recent years approximately 90% of community college credit enrollees have been Iowa residents. I do not foresee a significant change in the percentage of in-state and non-resident enrollments.
