




- The 15 community college districts in Iowa pay \$280.1 million in direct faculty and staff wages and salaries, and explain an additional \$2,760 million in wages and salaries off campus.
- Taxpayers see a real money "book" return of 9.5% on their annual investments in the community colleges and recover all investments in 12.8 years.
- Students enjoy an attractive 23% annual return on their investment of time and money—for every \$1 the student invests in a college education, he or she will receive a cumulative \$6.47 in higher discounted future earnings over the next 36 years.
- The State of Iowa benefits from improved health and reduced welfare, unemployment, and crime, saving the public some \$49.8 million per year.

A General State Aid appropriation increase in the amount of \$11.8 million would return state aid to the level of the 2001 fiscal year appropriations.
- RE-INSTATE THE TECHNOLOGY
 INSTRUCTIONAL EQUIPMENT PURCHASE
 PROGRAM WITH AN APPROPRIATION OF
 \$3 MILLION FOR THE 2005 FISCAL YEAR. In
 past years, community colleges received an appropriation of
 \$3 million per year to be used for the purchase of technology
 instructional equipment.
