Goals Achieved FY21

- 1. Expanded the on-line capabilities of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy:
 - Remodeled the ILEA website to include hosting of a career opportunities page that can be utilized by law enforcement agencies to post openings for law enforcement personnel
 - ➤ Implemented on-line form submission and processing for Regional Academies and Law Enforcement Agencies
 - Expanded the on-line campus in the topics of bias, de-escalation and the duty to intervene pursuant to House File 2647
 - Expanded use of the on-line campus for the Basic Academy, Jail Academy, Reserve Officer Academy and Certification through Examination
 - > Transitioned to on-line pre-employment testing
- 2. Gained VA approval for the use of the POST 9/11 GI-Bill for the Basic Academy, retroactive to July 31, 2020 pursuant to Senate File 387.
- 3. Demolition and repaying of both the upper East parking lot and the lower West parking lots.
- 4. Hired two Administrative Assistant 2 positions for the processing of change in employment files for peace officers.
- 5. The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy, Academy Council and Assistant Attorney General were able to complete substantial revisions to Iowa Administrative Code 501.

- 1. Internal Curriculum Review Committee to thoroughly review, update and revise training documents and materials for the 628 hours and 99 topics of the ILEA Basic Academy. - 2. Expansion of In-Service training through our learning management system for law enforcement, jailers and public safety telecommunicators to create On-Demand training opportunities for departments statewide.
- 3. Expand Advanced Law Enforcement Rapid Response Training (ALERRT) opportunities for local law enforcement agencies.
