

Iowa JPEC Overview

The John Pappajohn Entrepreneurial Center is the hub for entrepreneurship education and outreach at the University of Iowa.

Areas of focus include:

- Delivering campus-wide undergraduate and graduate forcredit education
- Accelerating student, faculty/staff, and community-based entrepreneurial ventures
- Connecting university students with state of lowa companies for strategic business consulting, internships, and placement
- Collaborating with external partners to enhance the state of lowa's entrepreneurial ecosystem and support economic development



FY 22 New Initiatives to Support Entrepreneurship and Economic Development

Statewide Venture Mentoring Service

In Summer 2021, Iowa JPEC, in partnership with the four other Pappajohn Centers, received a grant from the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation in Kansas City to launch a new statewide mentoring program for startups and early-stage ventures.

- → Partner with MIT to implement their internationally recognized mentor program.
- → Connect Iowa startups with successful entrepreneurs and industry leaders to help build and scale Iowa ventures.
- → Five Pappajohn Centers currently running/launching piloting programs; statewide implementation slated for fall 2022.

Iowa JPEC Program:

- → 20 Mentors
- → 10 Venture Teams

Spring 2022:

- → 30 Mentors
- → 20 Teams

Fall 2022:

- → 60 Mentors
- → 30 Teams



Campus-wide Graduate Student Entrepreneurial Ventures

→ Hawkeye Summer Accelerator – Graduate Student Track

- Pilot program launched in Summer 2021 (12 ventures)
- Intensive 11-week program to identify commercial potential for technology discoveries and build sustainable business models

→ Graduate Student Startup Incubator

- Pilot program launched this winter/spring (16 ventures)
- Startups continue early-stage commercialization work after completing lowa's NSF I-Corps training program






Scale Academy

Comprehensive training and support program for high potential entrepreneurial ventures affiliated with lowa JPEC

- → Entrepreneur-in-Residence for concierge-level next steps assistance
- → Venture Mentoring Service
- → CEO training
- → Fundraising assistance (state, angels, VC's, Series A), pitch coaching



- → Technical assistance / business consulting
- → Provide support for student interns

** Initial pilot in spring 2022; full program launch beginning fall 2022



FY 21 Program Recap

Campus-wide Academic Program

- → Students from 101 different undergraduate majors completed an entrepreneurship course in FY 21
- →374 students completed business consulting projects or internships for lowa businesses
- → Selected initial cohort for the new Entrepreneurial Leadership Academy—a specialized final-year experience for top undergraduate students in entrepreneurship programs
- → Celebrated 15th anniversary of the lowa JPEC-led Okoboji Entrepreneurial Institute

Campus-wide Entrepreneurship and New Venture Creation Activities

- → Startup Incubator: student entrepreneurship program that includes training, mentoring, physical space, technical and business support, and seed funding.
- → Hawkeye Summer Accelerator: intensive 11week program to foster the creation and launch of new entrepreneurial ventures.
- →Innovation Challenge: university-wide elevator pitch and business model competitions to support top entrepreneurial ventures.
- → Ideation Programs: IdeaStorm, Startup Games, and Game Changer events designed to provide students opportunities to pitch ideas and experience entrepreneurship.





Iowa JPEC - Statewide Business Support

Venture School – Iowa's premier statewide innovation and entrepreneurship training program for early-stage Iowa startups

 Delivered in-person and online in multiple cities across the state of lowa annually (7-10 program sites across lowa each year)

Entrepreneurship Interns – student interns placed with lowa-based companies to support business expansion and promote post-graduation employment opportunities in lowa

• Industries have included: agriculture, environmental, finance, insurance, medical, data analytics, software/IT, and marketing

lowa Business Consulting – interdisciplinary student teams directed by experienced entrepreneurs and business leaders complete strategic business consulting projects for lowa businesses

 Over 300 students assist 70+ lowa businesses annually across the state of lowa


