- 33 fiscal year beginning July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023,
- 34 the following amount, or so much thereof as is necessary, to be
- 35 used for the purposes designated:

For deposit in the water quality initiative fund created in 2 section 466B.45, for purposes of supporting the water quality 3 initiative administered by the division of soil conservation 4 and water quality as provided in section 466B.42, including 5 salaries, support, maintenance, and miscellaneous purposes:

4	GENERAL. This bill relates to agriculture and natural
5	resources by making appropriations for the fiscal year
6	2022-2023 to support related entities, including the department
7	of agriculture and land stewardship (DALS), the department of
8	natural resources (DNR), Iowa state university (ISU), and the
9	university of Iowa (UI).
10	The bill primarily appropriates moneys to DALS and DNR.
11	The appropriations are made to support those departments for
12	administration, regulation, and support of programs. The bill
13	requires the departments to submit quarterly reports to the
14	general assembly and department of management regarding the
15	expenditure of appropriated moneys. The bill also provides
16	moneys to support specific programs or projects administered
17	by those departments. Appropriations are made to support the
18	water quality initiative (WQI) administered by DALS.
19	The bill primarily appropriates moneys from the state
20	general fund (GF) and the environment first fund (EFF) to
21	support DALS and DNR but also UI and ISU, and to support
22	a number of designated activities, projects, and programs
23	administered by those agencies. General appropriations are
24	made from other major sources, including the state fish and
25	game protection fund (SFGPF) and the groundwater protection
26	fund (GPF) both administered by DNR. Finally, appropriations
27	are made from and to a number of dedicated sources, including
28	the resources enhancement and protection (REAP) fund
29	administered by DNR, and the renewable fuel infrastructure

- 4 The bill appropriates moneys from several sources to support a
- 5 number of designated purposes, including moneys derived from
- 6 unclaimed winnings from horse and dog races, for administration
- 7 and enforcement of racing regulations; and moneys credited to
- 8 the RFIF, for purposes of regulating motor fuel.
- 9 DALS SPECIAL GF APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes special
- 10 appropriations from the GF to DALS in order to support specific
- 11 purposes including milk inspection, the local food and farm
- 12 program, an agricultural education organization, foreign animal
- 13 disease preparedness, assistance to farmers with disabilities,
- 14 loess hills protections, southern Iowa development and
- 15 conservation, grain regulation, and a value added agriculture
- 16 grant program.
- 17 DALS GF APPROPRIATIONS WATER QUALITY. The bill
- 18 appropriates moneys from the GF to DALS for deposit in the
- 19 WQIF, to support the WQI including high-priority watershed
- 20 projects.
- 21 DNR GF AND OTHER MAJOR FUNDS APPROPRIATIONS. The bill
- 22 makes appropriations from a number of funds to DNR in order
- 23 to support its administrative divisions involving natural
- 24 resources and environmental protection from the GF, the SFGPF,
- 25 and the GPF.
- 26 DNR MISCELLANEOUS SOURCES DESIGNATED APPROPRIATIONS.
- 27 The bill appropriates moneys to DNR from a number of sources
- 28 to support designated purposes, including moneys deposited in
- 29 the special snowmobile fund to provide for administering and
- 30 enforcing the state snowmobile programs; and moneys deposited
- 31 in the unassigned revenue fund for purposes of paying for
- 32 administration of DNR's underground storage tanks section.
- 33 DNR SPECIAL GF APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes special
- 34 appropriations from the GF to DNR in order to support specific
- 35 purposes including floodplain management, dam safety and

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- 1 forestry health management programs, and state parks.
- 2 ISU SPECIAL GF APPROPRIATIONS. The bill appropriates
- 3 moneys from the GF to ISU to support the operation of its
- 4 veterinary diagnostic laboratory and livestock disease
- 5 research.
- 6 UI SPECIAL GF APPROPRIATIONS. The bill makes
- 7 appropriations from the GF to UI to support the operations of
- 8 Iowa's center for agricultural safety and health which is part
- 9 of UI's college of public health.
- 10 DALS, DNR, AND UI EFF GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS. The
- 11 bill appropriates moneys from the EFF to support a number of
- 12 programs administered by DALS, DNR, and UI. For DALS, the
- 13 moneys are appropriated to support programs involving soil
- 14 conservation, watershed protection and nutrient management,
- 15 and the loess hills development and conservation fund. For
- 16 DNR, moneys are appropriated to support programs involving
- 17 state parks, geographic information systems, water quality
- 18 monitoring, public water supplies, regulation of animal feeding
- 19 operations, air quality, and floodplain management and dam
- 20 safety. For UI, moneys are appropriated to support the Iowa
- 21 geological survey. The bill includes provisions that delay the
- 22 reversion of these moneys.
- 23 EFF SPECIAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR WQI. The bill
- 24 appropriates moneys from the EFF to the WQIF subject to the
- 25 same conditions applicable to moneys appropriated to the fund
- 26 from the GF.
- 27 REAP FUND EFF APPROPRIATION IN LIEU OF GF APPROPRIATION.
- 28 The bill appropriates moneys from the EFF to the REAP
- 29 fund instead of the \$20 million otherwise required to be
- 30 appropriated to the REAP fund from the GF. Notwithstanding
- 31 the standing allocation from the REAP fund to its open spaces
- 32 account, DNR may use moneys in the account for state park
- 33 maintenance and repair.
- 34 DALS GF CONTINGENT APPROPRIATIONS. The bill appropriates
- 35 moneys from the GF to DALS for deposit in the RFIF instead of

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1 moneys deposited in the RFIF from the GF as a standing limited
 2 appropriation. However, the provisions are contingent upon
 3 the enactment of pending legislation providing for renewable
 4 fuels as originally proposed by the governor. The bill also
 5 appropriates moneys from the GF to DALS to the choose Iowa fund
 6 to support a choose Iowa promotional program to increase the
 7 sale and purchase of Iowa products. However, the provisions
 8 are contingent upon the enactment of pending legislation
 9 originally proposed by DALS that creates the fund and program.
10
      STATUTORY PROVISIONS - DALS - VALUE ADDED AGRICULTURE
11 GRANT PROGRAM. The bill amends a provision enacted in 2021
12 that appropriated moneys to DALS for the administration of a
13 value added agricultural grant program.
                                           The bill provides
14 that DALS has until June 30, 2023, to obligate or encumber any
15 remaining appropriated moneys before those moneys revert to the
16 general fund. This provision takes effect upon enactment.
      STATUTORY PROVISIONS - DNR - CONSERVATION OFFICERS.
17
18 bill provides that any person appointed by the DNR director to
19 enforce state laws and departmental rules must be classified
20 as a conservation officer by a date determined by DNR but
21 not later than June 30, 2024. The bill provides that the
22 reclassification does not affect the status of persons waiting
23 to be reclassified. Such persons are still entitled to have
24 the same powers conferred upon peace officers, must still
25 retire at age 65, and have the same right to participate in
26 group health insurance plans provided by the state.
27 provisions allowing for this special status are eliminated on
28 July 1, 2024.
      STATUTORY PROVISIONS - DNR - OCCUPANCY OF HOUSING IN STATE
29
30 PARKS. The bill provides that a DNR employee who on January 1,
31 2022, occupied a state-owned residence located within a state
32 park may continue to occupy that residence under the same terms
33 and conditions that applied immediately prior to any action
34 taken by DNR to evict the employee. The provision allowing for
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35 the occupancy is eliminated on July 1, 2024.
