7 Essential Constructs Defined

Career Readiness

Students gain a marketable skill set that leads to being Future Ready.

Character and Self Development

 Ability to Identify elements of one's own character and how it relates to the world around them.

Communication & Technology

 Students will use communication and technology to develop appropriate skills to amplify one's ability to communicate, understand, and deliver messages.

Critical Thinking & Productivity

 Students are able to comprise long and short term goals through effective organization and time management so they are Future Ready.

Life Skills

 Students will use Life Skills & Effective Human Relations Skills to demonstrate appropriate behavior and social expectations through their ability to communicate, understand, and use proper social etiquette.

Self Advocacy & Conflict Resolution

 Students will be able to identify a support system that can lead to self advocacy and conflict resolution.

Work Based Learning

 Students will be prepared with intellectual, technical, and social skills necessary to be successful in their communities by experiencing post secondary education and/or work based training.
