





# International Student Challenges



challenges.

Language/Cultural Understanding - Students are often using their second language in a new place, trying to get across something that would have been effortless with a first language. Care, empathy, patience, and cultural sensitivity are critical.

Homesickness/Culture Shock - Students are dealing with a lot of emotions, and social/cultural adjustments are magnified.

Lack of local support system - Students have often just arrived in the U.S., many for the first time. Significant distance from family and friends heightens transition

**Finances** - Devaluation of currency, financial challenges at home (without access to need-based aid) can lead to financial stress.

Foster a Diverse Campus Environment- In the classroom, dorms, and in all campus spaces, international students enrich peer-to-peer interactions and student learning. A diverse campus prepares students for life in the 21st Century and careers in a global markets.

Create Significant Income Opportunities - It is beneficial for the hosting campus but also for the extended community.


Significant alumni contributions - Alumni include successful entrepreneurs, business and community leaders, and university donors. Their success are our success.
