Registration

Hiring or sponsoring agency must complete an information packet for the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy to verify that the officer has met the minimum standards for Iowa Law Enforcement Officers [administrative rule 501(80B)].

Once the officer has been registered, an information packet will be mailed to the officer or deputy's agency approximately four weeks prior to the start of the academy by the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy.

At the beginning of the line where you will indicate the proposed instructor, you will find one of the following symbols (g), (s), (p), and (gu). These symbols indicate the type of instructor required by Iowa Administrative Code to be used by regional training facilities. (g) indicates the individual is a general law enforcement instructor and qualifications for general instructors are set forth in 501—4.2 of the Iowa Administrative Code. (s) indicates that the instructor must be a specialist and qualifications for specialist instructors are set forth in Iowa Administrative Code 501—4.3 (p) indicates the instructor is to be a professional. These qualifications are set forth in 501 – 4.4. Under some circumstances a guest instructor may be utilized. For those subject areas, you will find a (gu) at the beginning of the proposed instructor line. Qualifications for guest instructors will be determined by the individual responsible for the Regional Training Program. Approval by the Academy Council is not necessary. {Iowa Administrative Code 501—4.1 (9)}. Instructor applications should be attached for those instructor(s) not currently certified by the Academy Council if you plan to use them in this program.

New Officer 8-week Basic Level II Certification

To become a certified police officer, Iowa law requires the successful completion of training at an approved law enforcement training facility. The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy Council has designated Hawkeye Community College as a Regional Law Enforcement Training Facility to provide certification training.

Officers must be certified within one year of their employment, unless the academy council has granted an extension under administrative rule 501-3.1(3) 80B.

Enrollment Requirements

To attend 8-week Basic Level II Certification Academy, you must first be hired or sponsored by a Law Enforcement Agency and satisfy the following eligibility requirements.

1. Officer has satisfactorily completed
 - o a two or four-year Police Science or Criminal Justice program at an accredited educational institution
 - OR
 - o law enforcement training in another state commensurate with basic training required in Iowa, and be able to provide verification of same.
2. Is a U.S. Citizen and a resident of Iowa or intend to become a resident upon being employed;
3. Is 18 years of age at the time of appointment;
4. Holds a valid Iowa Driver's license;
5. Is not addicted to drugs or alcohol [modified for Chapter 400 civil service positions by 400.17 of the Code of Iowa];
6. Is of good moral character as determined by a thorough back ground investigation including a fingerprint search conducted of local, state, and national fingerprint files and have not been convicted of a felony or a crime involving moral turpitude;

7. Has successfully passed a physical fitness test adopted by the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy. See physical agility requirements in item 14;
8. Is not by reason of conscience or belief opposed to the use of force, when necessary to fulfill that person's duties;
9. Has uncorrected vision of not less than 20/100 in both eyes, corrected to 20/20, and color vision consistent with the occupational demands of law enforcement;
10. Has normal hearing in each ear (hearing aids are acceptable if a candidate can demonstrate sufficient hearing proficiency to perform all necessary duties of a law enforcement officer);
11. Has been examined by a physician and meets the physical requirements necessary to fulfill the responsibilities of a law enforcement officer;
12. Undergo psychological testing;
13. Undergo cognitive [Basic Skills] testing. (paraphrased from the ILEA webpage, Frequently Asked Questions of the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy)
