# <u>Critical Budget Needs</u> (\$8,473,977 and 12 FTEs)

# 1. Hire more prosecutors to protect Iowans, assist victims, and support law enforcement.

\$884,090 to hire 3 attorneys, 2 investigators, 1 paralegal to properly staff the Statewide Prosecutions Section & Criminal Appeals Division

### 2. Build Cold Case Unit:

\$523,464 to hire 3 investigators & one prosecutor, over 400 active cases

## 3. Hire attorneys to push back against the Biden Administration:

\$286,596 to hire 1 attorney & 1 paralegal

### 4. Fund the increase provided to state employees on July 1, 2023:

\$545,466 for raises to fund the 3% increase in salaries for personnel funded by general appropriations

### 5. Flexibility within Consumer and Antitrust Enforcement Fund

Keep the same language as last year

#### 6. Support for victims of violent crime:

\$4,589,421 to replace anticipated cuts in federal funding

#### 7. Tobacco settlement replacement:

\$1,164,377 to replace funding used for attorney positions after settlement agreement adjustments

### 8. Technology & security upgrades:

\$480,563 as recommended by Governor Reynolds (\$202,060 from general fund & \$278,503 additional from tech reinvestment fund)

Requested additional operational funding: \$3,884,556 or Victim services replacement after federal cutbacks \$4,589,421 Total: \$8,473,977

## **Background on Attorney General's Office Budget**

- Staff is comprised of approximately 250 total employees, including 150 full-time attorneys
- Only 24% of operating budget (\$7.8 Million) is a general fund appropriation.
- Approximately 53% comes from billing of *some* agencies that pay for legal services.
- \$4 million is appropriated from the Consumer Education and Litigation Fund—both for consumer and other office functions—but sustainability of fund is uncertain.
- Victim Services Division is funded primarily from federal sources, these sources are making cuts across the board.
