


Economic Development Impact On-campus and Across Iowa

Campus Startup / Business Support



- → Expanded commercialization support for early-stage Graduate Students / Faculty / Staff
 - Goals:
 - Encourage exploration of commercialization paths
 - Increase success of federal grant applications
 - NSF I-Corps Great Lakes Region Hub affiliate member
 - \$360,000, two-year grant
 - 4 Workshops / 26 Teams
 - Startup Incubator 32 participants
- → Reinvigorated <u>undergraduate student</u> startup activity post-pandemic
 - Startup Incubator 43 teams / 49 students
 - Summer Startup Incubator 16 teams



Statewide Startup / Business Support

Venture School - Iowa's premier statewide innovation and entrepreneurship training program for early-stage Iowa startups

- 7-week business accelerator program
- 83 startups trained
- Delivered in-person training at 6 locations across lowa as well as virtually
- Offered in conjunction with partners:
 - Des Moines DMACC, SBDC
 - Dubuque The Innovation Lab
 - Iowa City / Cedar Rapids SBDCs
 - Mason City NIACC, SBDC
 - Quad Cities EICC, SBDC
 - Sioux City Iowa's West Coast Initiative, WIT, SBDC



Statewide Startup / Business Support

Venture Mentoring Service - World-class team mentoring program supporting entrepreneurs statewide

- Second year of program based on MIT model
- Iowa JPEC leads statewide initiative available at all 5 Pappajohn Centers
- Rural communities outside of the geographic regions of the other 4 Centers are served by Iowa JPEC

Statewide Startup / Business Support

Business Consulting – interdisciplinary student teams directed by experienced entrepreneurs and business leaders complete strategic business consulting projects for lowa businesses

- Over 300 students assist 50+ lowa businesses annually across the state
- Counties served: Adair, Allamakee, Blackhawk, Dubuque, Hennepin, Johnson, Linn, Louisa, Mitchell, Polk, Poweshiek, Scott, Washington, and Woodbury

lowa Enterprise Interns – student interns placed with lowa-based companies to support business expansion and promote post-graduation employment opportunities in lowa

- Over 12 interns placed in 8 startups across the state
- Industries have included: agriculture, environmental, finance, insurance, medical, data analytics, software/IT, and marketing
- Counties served: Dallas, Dubuque, Johnson, Linn, and Plymouth



FY25 Initiative – IOWA Venture Fund

- →2021 legislation allows Regent's institutions to make investments in private enterprises
- →UI is in the process of developing a Venture Fund
- → lowa is one of the few B1G and R1 institutions without a fund
- → Investments will be made in UI-affiliated early-stage businesses including:
 - Startups owned by current students, faculty, and staff, recent alumni, and those engaged in Iowa JPEC entrepreneurial support programs across the state
- → Funded by donations through the UI Center for Advancement
- → Investments anticipated to be in the \$50,000 \$250,000 range
- → Will also provide educational opportunities for undergraduate students (due diligence and portfolio management)



New Partnership

- → The Tippie College of Business, with the support of Iowa JPEC and the Vaughn Institute of Risk Management, has entered a partnership with the Des-Moines based Global Insurance Accelerator
- → For the 2024 Cohort, Iowa JPEC has redesigned the curriculum
- → UI Students will be offered internship and consulting opportunities with the startups
- → GIA Managing Director Dan Israel, "Couldn't be more thrilled with the partnership"





Academic Program Impact

Entrepreneurship Academic Program

- Delivered 94 sections of undergraduate courses and 9 online MBA courses
- Students from 90 different undergraduate majors completed an entrepreneurship course
- BBA in Entrepreneurship moving through the final approval process; expect Fall 24 launch
- 269 students completed 71 consulting projects
- Sponsored five students to attend the 35th Roth Conference in CA


Building Pathways to Commercialization



Culture

Establishing a foundation to transform ideas to impact:

- Infrastructure: State support creating a medical innovation hub
- Seed Funding: Goal to award 500K funding provided per year for Engineering, Nursing, Dentistry, Education, Pharmacy
- Match Making: Bringing external advisors and venture capitalists, engaging industry experts "just in time" support f o r faculty/staff, trainee innovations.
- Alternative entrepreneurial pilots: State-wide Nursing Innovation, Biodesign program pilot, Iowa Innovation Fellows program designed to attract innovation
- Communication Strategies: synergies across campus, local gov, w/ IEDA and w/external stakeholders
- Benchmarking best practices: codifying what attracts entrepreneurial faculty by studying best practices at peer institutions


Highlighting Biosciences offerings created or impacted with Legislative funding since FY2019

Faculty/Staff Startup Support Continuum






Supporting Inventors across the Entrepreneurial Continuum
