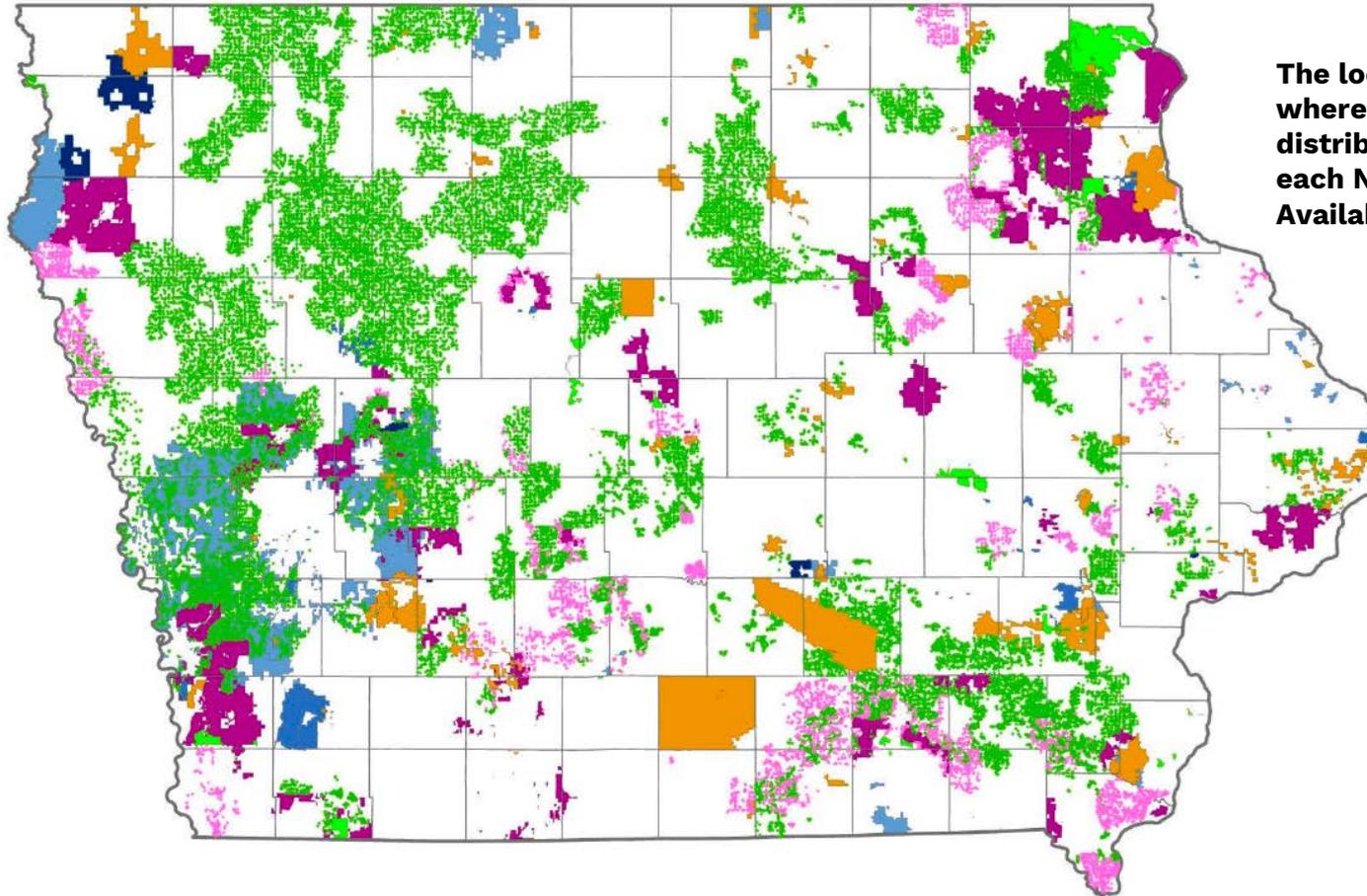
- Implementing vendor scorecard
- Establishing a whitelist for approved IT goods and services
- Unifying project management system
- Consolidating IT ticketing system
- Evaluating contractor staff pool for efficiencies
- Outsourcing networking support
- Implementing enterprise IT policies
- Developing enterprise and agency IT strategic plans

Broadband

Since 2018, the Division of Information Technology (formerly OCIO) has coordinated the Empower Rural Iowa Grant program to accelerate broadband expansion in unserved and underserved locations across the State of Iowa.

- 8 State and Federal rounds of funding to date
- \$500 million in State and Federal funds awarded
- 301 applications awarded
- Estimated \$1 billion in total new broadband investment (private + public funds)
- Estimated 106,000 homes, schools, and businesses served in 99 counties upon project completion
- **New federal funding opportunities**
 - IIJA/BIL Broadband, Equity, Access, and Deployment - \$400 million
 - IIJA/BIL Digital Equity Act - \$8.4 million
