




Iowa Drug Trends


- → Reported meth labs in Iowa have dropped by approximately 87% since their peak in 2004.
- → However, 2008 saw a 13% increase in meth labs compared to 2007.

Meth Lab Incident Responses (Iowa DPS-CYs):











- → Drug-related prison admissions, driven by reductions in meth cases, have declined for the 4th straight year.
- → About 80% of offenders in Iowa prisons had a past or current drug problem. Among those inmates, 52% of women and 50% of men had used meth. Roughly 51% of prisoners needing treatment get it (Iowa DOC & CJJP, 2006-2008).
- \rightarrow Iowa still has the 9^{th} highest number of meth treatment admissions in the nation (2006 TEDS).
- A study of open child abuse cases in SW IA shows meth involved in 51% in 2007, versus 46.7% in 2006. Although the percentage is up, the actual numbers of total cases and meth related cases have both gone down (Iowa DHS).

Presence of an Illegal Drug in Child's Body (Confirmed Child Abuse Cases, Iowa DHS-CYs)




- → Authorities report a rise in crystal meth, a more potent form of meth, smuggled into Iowa from Mexico and other states.
- → Child abuse due to meth labs is declining, but over 8,700 drug-affected cases were reported in the last 7 years (IA DHS-CYs).

→ Public calls to the Statewide Poison Control Center to identify Hydrocodone and Oxycodone pills have increased 748% since 2002.


Hydrocodone and Oxycodone ID Calls from Iowans (Iowa SPCC-CYs)




Three recent Iowa Youth Surveys show steady drops in substance use among 6th, 8th & 11th grade students.

Primary Substance of Abuse Trends Among <u>Youth and Adults</u> (Iowa DPH-FYs)



- → Of Iowa youth seeking treatment, 52% cited marijuana as their primary substance of abuse (Iowa DPH, SFY 2007).
- → Alcohol is the substance most abused by Iowans... 58.3% of clients screened/admitted to treatment (Iowa DPH, SFY2007).
- → For SFY2008, Iowa liquor sales increased by 6.4%, beer sales rose by 1.8% and wine sales by 3% (ABD, SFY 2008).



→ So much alcohol was sold, the average <u>adult</u> Iowan consumed 37.23 gallons of beer, 1.98 gallons of liquor, and 1.69 gallons of wine during the 12 month period of SFY2008 (ABD, SFY2008).
