If the operator has a key, our current course of action is to inventory the machine and provide a receipt for the money seized. We do not need a court order to inventory the machine if a key is available and the machine is being seized. All inventoried proceeds are held as evidence until the court decision.

It is my understanding that approximately \$694 of the \$3215 has been dispersed to agencies through the court process. The rest of the inventoried money from seized amusement devices continues to be held as evidence pending court determination.

The Division of Criminal Investigation has not routinely inventoried nor tracked the funds from seized machines. Most of the machines seized

remain in storage and are awaiting court action. In instances where the machines were inventoried, it resulted in a total of \$3,215 which was dispersed pursuant to court order. Beginning January 1st, the assets of seized machines will be inventoried and will be included in the regular monthly report maintained by DCI.
