Iowa Vocational Rehabilitation Services (IVRS) is a division of the Iowa Department of Education

- 273.5 FTE manage and provide services to individuals with disabilities to prepare for, obtain and maintain employment (79/21 match required)
- 1 FTE manages and provides services to persons with disabilities to maintain independent functioning in the community (90/10 match required)
- 3.0 FTE manage grant funding directed to improving transition outcomes for students with disabilities at the community level (100% Federal Funds)
- 143.95 FTE manage and provide eligibility determinations for Social Security benefits for persons with disabilities (100% Federal Funds)

Non-Federal Match requirement


- 21% State/Non-Federal Funding: 79% Federal Funding
 - o FFY 2006: (actual)
 - \$210,744 State/Non-Federal short of match requirement
 - \$778,664 to reallocate to other States
 - FFY 2007: (estimate with Governor's recommendation of \$203,705)
 - \$0 State/Non-Federal short of match requirement
 - \$0 to reallocate to other States
 - Challenge:
 - Third party match
 - Disproportionate impact upon specific populations
 - Restricts use of funds to only areas where funds are available, not necessarily where the greatest need exists
- Federal funding is increasing faster than State appropriations
 - 3.8% increase for VR in FFY 2007 overall; allotment to IVRS unknown but expected to be at least 2%
 - History has been at least 2% for the last 10 years
 - VR is a "Mandatory" program, not subject to "across the board" cuts, receives annual COLA

State Fiscal Year 2008 Budget Offers

- Governor's recommendation \$203,705
 - State Rehabilitation Council recommendation

Waiting list

- Waiting list has grown by 49% since January of 2006
 - o No new cases off the caseload from mid-February 2006 through June 2006
 - Referrals are independent of funds available; average about 575 monthly
 - The number of consumers placed into services are dependent on funds available
 - Current waiting list for persons with significant disabilities is approximately 10 months
 - o Placed 3600 individuals into services since July 2006
 - Current trend is 575 into services each month



additional \$203,705 (the Governor's recommendation).

Iowa Business Network

- Recognizes employers as a valued customer
- Identifies employer needs for recruitment and retention of qualified applicants/employees
- Builds the capacity of VR staff to deliver direct services to employers
 - o Pre-employment
 - o Recruitment
 - o Retention
 - o Staff training
 - o Consultation, technical assistance and support

Service Delivery Model

- Efficiency, effectiveness and control
 - More direct services provided Creates more manageable quality of service and more control of expenditures
- Risk of implementation
 - Community partners will see less purchased services Staffing resources have to be realigned – Accountability of IVRS service delivery system
- Benefit to consumers
 - Less volatile swing of expenditures More consistent services Greater access to IVRS counselors - Greater access to employers
