Osteopathic Forgivable Loan Program


This program requires graduates of Des Moines University to practice medicine in Iowa communities. The Governor's proposal includes a state appropriation of \$200,000 and Des Moines University will match the amount with \$200,000 to provide \$4,200 in forgivable Ioans for up to 30 additional students. Ninety-four students are receiving assistance from previous appropriations. Upon completion of residency programs, students receiving forgivable Ioans give quality health care to Iowans.

Osteopathic Physician Recruitment Program

This program attracts and retains qualified medical professionals to lowa communities with populations of less than 10,000 residents. The Governor's proposal of \$346,451 will provide up to six physicians in as many rural communities with loan repayment benefits. Iowa communities struggling to attract qualified medical professionals match the state's loan repayment benefits.

Since its start in 1994, the Osteopathic Physician Recruitment Program (OPRP) has contracted with eighty-six Doctors of Osteopathy to practice in underserved Iowa communities. All of the physicians are D.O.s, eighty from Des Moines University and six from other D.O. programs. The program, funded by a State of Iowa grant, began by providing a physician \$30,000 toward student Ioan reduction with an equivalent amount contributed by the employing community, hospital or clinic – or sometimes a combination of sources. The current Ioan reduction payment is a minimum of \$100,000 split between the State contribution of \$50,000 and a minimum \$50,000 expected from the employer or community.

Des Moines University does not provide funding for the program, but instead acts as a broker between communities seeking physicians and physicians looking for both a practice location and an opportunity to reduce long-term student debt. The University does, however, make the loan repayments on behalf of the physician.

At its origin, only primary care physicians (family medicine, internal medicine and pediatrics) were eligible. That restriction was later expanded to include emergency medicine as recognition of the realities of medical practice in smaller or rural communities. Currently, all medical specialties are accepted. Only communities in Iowa are eligible.

A physician accepting the funds must agree to practice in a placement community and must agree to practice for a minimum of four years. If the four year commitment is not met, a pro-rated portion of the State funds must be repaid (in accordance with the placement contract) to a revolving fund.

Retention of physicians in Iowa was and is a major goal of the program. This chart of placements speaks to the success of the OPRP program. Sixteen physicians are still under contract in Iowa.
