FY14 Allocations for funding from HF604

- Legislature Appropriated \$16.9 million in HF604 and directed that \$1 million be allocated to MainStreet in HF620
 - Projects \$8.275 million
 - Admin \$1.5 million
 - Laborsheds \$275,000
 - IT/TA \$650,000
 - Site Certification \$400,000
 - Regional Marketing \$200,000
 - Iowa Innovation Corp. Programming \$5.0 million
 - Internship Program \$400,000
 - Demonstration Fund \$2.0 million
 - Iowa Acceleration Fund (state) \$1.35 million
 - Iowa Innovation Corporation Support \$1.25 million
 - Main Street Challenge Grants \$1 million

Objectives

- Assess current position and trends in lowa's existing and emerging industry clusters
- Identify new markets for growth
- Assess the progress of past efforts
- Develop workforce attraction/retention strategies
- Assess existing infrastructure and other assets for economic growth
- Develop a forward-looking roadmap for economic development efforts

- New Wealth = Focused incentives:
 - Businesses competing in national or international markets
 - R&D sector
 - New Economy
- Permanent jobs = Tax incentives with "strings":
 - Performance-based
 - Tied to capital investment and job creation
- Return On Investment = Fiscal Impact Ratio (FIR) & REMI Model

High Quality Jobs Program

- Program provides direct financial assistance and tax incentives for qualifying businesses
- Tax incentives include:
 - Investment tax credit against income tax liability
 - Refund of state sales, service or use taxes for construction materials
 - Supplemental state research activities credit
 - Optional local property tax exemption of value added to the property
- Incentive amounts tied to job creation and wages
- Key Requirements
 - Company must meet qualifying wage thresholds
 - Story County: = Starting wage of at least \$16.34/hr progressing to \$19.12 /hr over the project performance period, typically 3 years
 - Business must provide sufficient benefits package
 - Non-retail or non-service business



Innovation Corporation Board

- Accelerate the generation and development of innovative ideas and research into investable ventures
 - SBIR/STTR Support
 - Industry/University Applied Research Investments
- Foster the development of the innovation ecosystem
 - Innovation Extension Partnership
- Develop, link and coordinate capital providers to invest in innovation-based lowa ventures
 - Seed Fund manager finalist identified, announcement coming soon

Certified Site Program

- Partnering with McCallum Sweeney, highly regarded in the field
- Expecting first-round Mega Site certifications by yearend
 - Dexter, Ft. Dodge, Van Meter, Clinton, Iowa Falls, Sioux City, Wever,
 Middletown, Adel and Cedar Rapids all working toward certification
- Recently launched General Industrial Site Program
 - Single site: 50 249 contiguous acres
 - Industrial Park: 100+ acres with one site ≥ 50 acres
 - Limit one site per county in each application round
 - New application round will open in January 2014

SPENT ON PRIVATE SECTOR ACQUISITION AND REHABILITATION

- Net business gain in MSI districts occurred in all 26 years of the state Main Street program
- 3,800 business starts, expansions and re-locations
- Sales tax collections from net new businesses in MSI districts is 48 times the state approp to fund program
- Kicked off new MSI application process
 - 22 communities eligible to apply
- \$1 million Challenge Grant funding currently available to existing MSI communities





MSI Challenge Grants – FY14

Challenge Grants - \$950,000

- Bricks and mortar projects
- Grant amounts ranging from \$15,000-\$75,000
- Applications due Nov. 1, 2013
 - Received 27 apps, requesting \$1.8 million
 - Awards scheduled to be made in Jan. 2014

Business Innovation Challenge Grants - \$100,000

- Innovative, creative projects supporting local business retention, expansion and recruitment efforts
- Grant amounts ranging from \$5,000-\$20,000
- Applications due Feb. 14, 2014
 - Expect to fund five to 10 projects
 - Awards scheduled to be made in April 2014






