

- Elder Protection










Local funds and contributions through each Area Agency on Aging allows greater independence beyond federal and state funds.







- Advocacy beyond complaint handling: 4,445 hours
- Consultations: 2,328

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Volunteer Ombudsman Program (VOP)

- Added an additional volunteer coordinator in 2013
- 25 volunteers certified and placed
- 70 additional volunteers are in process
- 861 applications have been mailed

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


\$107,608 (Governor's Budget)
