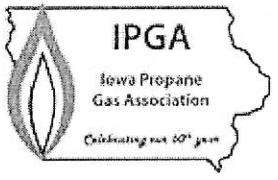

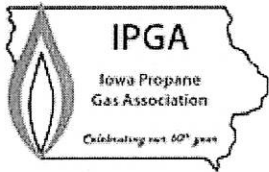

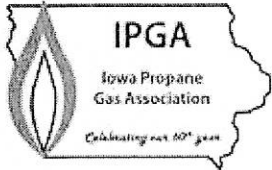

UPDATE:

As reported on Wednesday, August 17, 2011, the West Red and Blue pipelines were shut down due to severe flooding on the Missouri River where the pipelines cross near Decatur, Nebraska, just south of the Whiting Terminal. With floodwaters in the area anticipated to persist, Mid-America Pipeline has concluded that a traditional repair-in-place procedure is not feasible and is instead pursuing a directional drill solution to replace both pipeline river crossings.

As of today, all required repair permits have been received, and MAPL has begun re-drilling the river crossings. Our contractor currently estimates that the first pipeline (West Blue, in propane service) will be returned to service by the third week in October. The second line (West Red) will follow within 2 weeks.

We will continue to work with our contractors to assure the safe and most expeditious reconstruction of our Missouri River crossings for these two pipelines.

We appreciate the patience and support of our customers, and will continue to provide updated information regarding our progress.

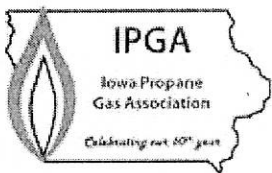

Hi, Harold. We are questioning whether the emergency proclamation that relaxed hours of service rules for drivers hauling propane, gas, and diesel should be extended beyond October 25. I understand the driving force behind this was a disruption of three pipeline crossing the Missouri River. I just discussed with Kevin Eppens at the Iowa Office of Energy Independence, and he indicates the propane line that was disrupted was reopened yesterday, and that the other two (one for gas, one for anhydrous ammonia) are being bored and will reopen in the next couple of weeks. Between that and the reverse flow of another pipeline that is bringing propane in from the east, he felt that the crisis has passed. As responsibility for propane has shifted to IDALS, however, he suggested a check in with you to get your assessment and

input. Please let me know your thoughts when you have a moment. The proclamation will expire October 25 so I am sure the Governor's office will want our recommendation before Monday. Thanks!

To Governors' Washington DC Representatives and State-Federal Contacts:

The National Governors Association Center for Best Practices is pleased to invite your governor to send a team to the National Summit on Government Redesign: Solutions for Making Tough Budget Choices to be held in Alexandria, Virginia (near Reagan National Airport) on December 13 and 14, 2011. Travel-related expenses will be covered for two participants from each state, and you are welcome to send more at your own expense.

Since 2008, governors have been enacting major changes to state government in an effort to reduce costs and improve efficiency. The summit will allow state teams to learn about best practices and share experiences around those efforts to reform and streamline state government. The meeting will emphasize those reforms and changes that reduce the cost of state government as opposed to those reforms that make government more efficient but do not reduce its cost. Participants will hear from national experts and their peers in other states on topics such as how to implement a budget review, managing state assets, agency consolidation and streamlining, pension and benefit reform, changing Medicaid to constrain cost growth, corrections reforms, and managing K-12 budgets to promote efficiency. The meeting will include

a mix of plenary and breakout sessions so that state teams can learn about national trends as well as specific case examples.

Participating individuals or teams should be appointed by the governor. Teams should be comprised of senior state leaders such as, budget directors, policy directors agency directors, and chiefs of staff, who are in a position to develop and implement substantial changes in policies and practices covered on the agenda (attached). Travel-related expenses will be covered for up to two participants from each state. Covered expenses will include airfare, ground travel and two nights hotel lodging in Washington, D.C. Those individuals who register for reimbursement will be directed to work with NGA's travel and logistics coordinator after they register (see below). I. Description and Purpose

The Iowa Department of Public Health (Iowa e-Health) plans to develop a statewide health information exchange known as the Iowa Health Information Network (IHIN), to connect health care participants (providers, hospitals, health plans, state government, and consumers) and facilitate the exchange of health information between them for purposes of payment, treatment, healthcare operations (all as defined by HIPAA), and population health management. The parties are entering into this Memorandum of Understanding and Commitment (MOU) to memorialize their agreement as to certain rights and responsibilities during the development, testing and implementation of the IHIN.

II. Commitments

- A. **Pilot:** Iowa e-Health seeks a commitment from Participant to participate in the pilot and to become a first adopter of the IHIN. Participant agrees to participate in the pilot of the IHIN, including collaborating with Iowa e-Health in the development of requirements and features for quality metrics that will provide value in the IHIN to Participant. In return for this opportunity to participate, Participant agrees that it will use the IHIN as a means of collecting quality measures from providers, once the functionality is tested and fully operational. In further consideration for Participant participating in the pilot and becoming a first adopter, Iowa e-Health will reduce Participant’s services fee for the first year of operations by 50%, as provided in Attachment B to this MOU. The parties agree that in the event that the IHIN fails to provide the functionality and services as provided in Attachment A by the estimated target dates provided in Attachment A, Participant will have the opportunity to initiate renegotiation of the fees set forth on Attachment B.
- B. **Financial:** The IHIN will be developed, installed and tested using federal and state funds. Government is assuming all of the risks in building the system. In order to secure the necessary government funding for development, Iowa e-Health must provide assurances that participants key to its success, including the State’s largest health systems and payers, will participate in the IHIN for a period of five years, and will pay fees for the services provided by Iowa e-Health. Accordingly, and in consideration for the services as specified in Attachment A to this MOU, Participant agrees to pay the fees associated with such services, as provided in Attachment B. The parties acknowledge that the Participant will be responsible for all costs associated with any modifications to its internal systems to enable its connection to the IHIN, subject to the limitations set forth in Attachment B.

III. Term

The term of this MOU is five years, beginning with the effective date set forth in Section V, contingent upon the parties entering into a Participation Agreement establishing the terms of use of the IHIN, and subject to termination by the parties as set forth herein. The parties expressly agree that in addition to the requirement to enter into a Participation Agreement, Participant’s financial obligations are conditioned upon Iowa e-Health meeting all of the requirements for payment (referred to as



"Triggers") set forth in Attachment B. Iowa e-Health may terminate this MOU if, in its sole opinion, there are insufficient funds to allow Iowa e-Health to operate the IHIN, or if Iowa e-Health's authorization to conduct its business or engage in activities or operations related to the IHIN is withdrawn or materially altered or modified. Either party may terminate this MOU if the parties are unable to reach agreement on the terms of a Participation Agreement, and Participant may terminate this MOU in the event Iowa e-Health does not meet the Triggers set forth on Attachment B. Participant may immediately terminate this MOU in the event Participant's claims or payment data is provided through the IHIN, or if the IHIN is used by any provider for the payment of claims. Participant may also terminate this MOU if there is an increase of 10% or more in the service fees payable by Participant as provided in Attachment B during any year of the Term, or if a change in the ownership or governance structure of the IHIN results in: 1) an increase of the voting membership to a size greater than thirteen members, or 2) a loss of representation by a health insurance carrier. The parties agree that any early termination of this MOU will relieve the parties from any obligations set forth in Attachments A and B, including but not limited to Participant's obligations to pay the annual fees set forth on Attachment B, except for those obligations already accrued as of the effective date of termination.

IV. Incorporated by Reference

This MOU incorporates by reference Attachments A and B.

Re: district court ruling

As you may be aware, the Iowa Society of Anesthesiologists (ISA) and the Iowa Medical Society (IMS) brought suit last year against the Department of Public Health and the Board of Nursing. The lawsuit sought to nullify a Board of Nursing rule that permitted ARNPs to provide direct supervision of radiologic technologists in the performance of fluoroscopy. The ISA believed such expansion of nursing practice via administrative rule was not permitted under Iowa law. On Wednesday, Judge Reis ruled on a motion for summary judgment in favor of ISA and IMS, finding that the Board of Nursing rule is held to "invalid, illegal and of no effect." In short, the Judge found that Iowa Code prohibited the desired expansion of nursing practice into areas of medicine because the expansion was not recognized by both the nursing and medical professions as required by Iowa Code Chapter 152.1.

The judge's ruling upholds the provisions of Iowa Code Chapter 152 that have longed helped to protect patient safety and distinguish the practice of nursing from the practice of medicine. If you have any questions, please let us know. The decision, of course, could be appealed. Below we've provided some excerpts from the ruling.

Justin

In her ruling, the judge stated the following:

Action of the Iowa Board of Nursing

The Iowa Legislature, in defining the practice of nursing, specifically limited that practice when it said the "practice of nursing" means the practice of a registered nurse or a licensed practical nurse. It does not mean any of the following: (a) The practice of medicine and surgery and the practice of osteopathic medicine and surgery, as defined in Chapter 148, ...except practices which are recognized by the medical and nursing professions and approved by the Board and properly performed by a registered nurse. (Iowa Code § 152.1(5)(a)).

The Iowa Code does not provide IBN with unfettered discretion to allow ARNPs to engage in the practice of medicine and it specifically prohibits the expansion of nursing practice into areas of medicine absent recognition of the medical professions. The Iowa Board of Nursing itself, both in its rulemaking process and in its support of the Iowa Department of Public Health rulemaking, could not set forth or point to any recognized standards showing that the medical or nursing professions have recognized ARNP supervision of fluoroscopy either in national training, education or curriculum standards. In fact, the Iowa Association of Nurse Anesthetists admitted during the rulemaking process that CRNAs - an even smaller subspecialty in the scope of nursing - do not receive sufficient training at the University of Iowa Nurse Anesthesia program to make CRNA's competent to utilize fluoroscopy in practice.

The medical profession's objections and IBN survey demonstrate as a matter of law that ARNPs' "direct supervision" of fluoroscopy as the term is defined within these rules is not a recognized practice by the medical profession. As such the IBN's rule exceeds its statutorily delegated authority and violates Iowa law.

Action of the Iowa Department of Public Health

IDPH serves as the state's radiation control agency responsible for regulating the use of radiation machines and radioactive materials, including fluoroscopy. (Iowa Code § 136C.3). A person (other than a "licensed professional") may not operate or use radioactive materials for medical treatment or diagnostic purposes unless that person has completed a course of instruction approved by the department or has otherwise met the minimum training requirements established by the department. (Iowa Code § 136C.14). A licensed professional is a person licensed or otherwise authorized by law to practice medicine, osteopathic medicine, podiatry, chiropractic, dentistry, dental hygiene, or veterinary medicine. ARNPs are not licensed professionals under this definition. (Iowa Code § 136C.1). ARNPs are not "licensed practitioners". (IAC § 641-38.2).

IDPH must establish minimum criteria and safety standards, including continuing education requirements, and administer examinations and disciplinary procedures for operators of radiation machines and users of radioactive materials who are not "licensed professionals". (Iowa Code §136C.3(1); Iowa Code § 136C.3(2)(a)). In order for ARNPs to provide "direct supervision" of fluoroscopy as the term is defined within the Iowa Administrative Code, they must satisfy minimum education and safety standards, including continuing education requirements and an examination established by the Iowa Department of Public Health. IDPH may not abrogate this duty to IBN.

Even if the expansion of practice by IBN had been valid, which is not the case, neither the IBN or IDPH rules establish a curriculum or minimum criteria and safety standards, including continuing education requirements and an examination as required by law for ARNPs to provide direct supervision of fluoroscopy; rather, the rules are the product of one board's work, setting forth broadly stated training requirements that neither reflect nor connect in any way to any curriculum, training and certification standards developed through the work and consensus of professional standard-

setting bodies, whether in nursing or medicine, to assure nursing proficiency and public health safety in the field of radiology.

The record before this Court reflects that the desired expansion of nursing practice sought by IBN and IDPH has not been recognized by either the medical or nursing professions nor in standards of radiation health and safety. The Iowa General Assembly, both in Iowa Code Chapter 152 pertaining to nursing, and in the Radiation Machines and Radioactive Materials Act found at Iowa Code Chapter 136C, requires that this threshold be met, which is lacking in this case. Both the IBN and IDPH failed in their rulemaking to meet these minimal statutory requirements.

NGA, NASBO SAY STATES FACING 'BIG SQUEEZE' ACCORDING TO LATEST FISCAL SURVEY

Findings Underscore Constrained Fiscal Condition

WASHINGTON—While the overall fiscal condition of states has improved from the depths of the recession, the *Fall 2011 Fiscal Survey of States*, released today by the National Governors Association (NGA) and the National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO), shows that states are facing a 'big squeeze' from both local and federal governments. The combination of the effects of the economic downturn, tepid economic growth and the expiration of Recovery Act and other federal funds has severely impeded the growth of state resources. Additionally, spending on Medicaid is expected to consume an increasing share of state budgets and grow much more rapidly than state revenue growth, resulting in slow or no growth in education, transportation or public safety.

Overall, state 2012 enacted budgets include nearly \$667 billion in general fund expenditures, a 2.9 percent increase compared to \$648 billion in general fund spending in 2011. Despite the second year with an increase, total enacted general fund spending in 2012 is still \$21 billion less than the pre-recession high of \$687 billion in 2008.

At the same time, local government revenues have been severely impacted by the decline in housing values. Many local governments, including school districts, rely heavily on property taxes to support their activities. These jurisdictions have been pressing states for more local assistance.

"State governments are feeling the squeeze from the demands for spending from both local and federal governments," said **NGA Executive Director Dan Crippen**. "Revenues are up slightly, but they do not yet meet 2008 levels, and the reduction of federal funds compounds the fiscal challenges for states."

Although state general fund revenues increased in both 2011 and 2012, the dramatic declines in revenue collections experienced in 2009 and 2010 leaves total general fund revenues in 2012 \$21 billion below their 2008 level. Specifically, revenue collections in 2012 reflect a 5.2 percent increase in personal income tax revenue and a 0.1 percent decrease in corporate income tax revenue and, in addition, a 0.3 percent decrease in sales tax revenue (in part because of the end of temporary sales increases in a few states). This growth will likely not be enough to even overcome the reductions in federal funds provided through the Recovery Act that began in 2011.

"This report shows that state budgets are certainly improving, however growth is weak and there is not enough money for all of the bills coming in," said **NASBO Executive Director Scott Pattison**. "State officials will still be cutting some programs and increases in funding for any program except for health care will be rare."

The downward revision last week in the estimates for economic growth, the continued fiscal exigencies of the federal government, weakness in housing and the inexorable growth in Medicaid spending all mean there is little relief in sight for state budgets.

NGA, NASBO SAY STATES FACING 'BIG SQUEEZE' ACCORDING TO LATEST FISCAL SURVEY

Findings Underscore Constrained Fiscal Condition

WASHINGTON—While the overall fiscal condition of states has improved from the depths of the recession, the *Fall 2011 Fiscal Survey of States*, released today by the National Governors Association (NGA) and the National Association of State Budget Officers (NASBO), shows that states are facing a 'big squeeze' from both local and federal governments. The combination of the effects of the economic downturn, tepid economic growth and the expiration of Recovery Act and other federal funds has severely impeded the growth of state resources. Additionally, spending on Medicaid is expected to consume an increasing share of state budgets and grow much more rapidly than state revenue growth, resulting in slow or no growth in education, transportation or public safety.

Overall, state 2012 enacted budgets include nearly \$667 billion in general fund expenditures, a 2.9 percent increase compared to \$648 billion in general fund spending in 2011. Despite the second year with an increase, total enacted general fund spending in 2012 is still \$21 billion less than the pre-recession high of \$687 billion in 2008.

At the same time, local government revenues have been severely impacted by the decline in housing values. Many local governments, including school districts, rely heavily on property taxes to support their activities. These jurisdictions have been pressing states for more local assistance.

“State governments are feeling the squeeze from the demands for spending from both local and federal governments,” said **NGA Executive Director Dan Crippen**. “Revenues are up slightly, but they do not yet meet 2008 levels, and the reduction of federal funds compounds the fiscal challenges for states.”

Although state general fund revenues increased in both 2011 and 2012, the dramatic declines in revenue collections experienced in 2009 and 2010 leaves total general fund revenues in 2012 \$21 billion below their 2008 level. Specifically, revenue collections in 2012 reflect a 5.2 percent increase in personal income tax revenue and a 0.1 percent decrease in corporate income tax revenue and, in addition, a 0.3 percent decrease in sales tax revenue (in part because of the end of temporary sales increases in a few states). This growth will likely not be enough to even overcome the reductions in federal funds provided through the Recovery Act that began in 2011.

“This report shows that state budgets are certainly improving, however growth is weak and there is not enough money for all of the bills coming in,” said **NASBO Executive Director Scott Pattison**. “State officials will still be cutting some programs and increases in funding for any program except for health care will be rare.”

The downward revision last week in the estimates for economic growth, the continued fiscal exigencies of the federal government, weakness in housing and the inexorable growth in Medicaid spending all mean there is little relief in sight for state budgets.

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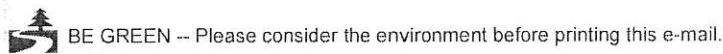

Our office received your December 9, 2011 letter regarding your client's concerns regarding the impartiality of Director Roger Lande. Your client, Clean Air Muscatine, expressed concerns regarding the handling of the civil enforcement action involving Grain Processing Corporation (GPC). Our office's understanding is the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), under the direction of Director Lande, referred this matter to the Attorney General's Office. Currently, the matter is being handled and investigated by the Attorney General's Environmental Law Division. Both the department and our office take environmental issues seriously and I would like to clarify a few of your concerns.

The DNR has and will continue to comply with Iowa law and regulations when issuing air pollution alerts, specifically, 567 I.A.C. Chapter 26 for monitored exceedances of one-hour sulfur dioxide (SO₂) levels National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). This rule establishes 24-hour SO₂ levels that trigger the declarations of air pollutions alerts (300 ppb), warnings (600 ppb), or emergencies (800 ppb) when meteorological conditions are such that the concentrations are expected to remain at those levels for twelve or more hours, or increase, unless control actions are taken. In this case, the highest 24-hour average value measured in the past ten years at the location in question was 107 ppb, well below the levels required by Iowa law to issue an alert. Data from the SO₂ monitor at the location in question is made available at: <http://www.shl.uiowa.edu/services/ambient/realtime.xml>. Due to the work of the DNR, including Director Roger Lande, coupled with the actions of the Environmental Protection Commission, on April 29, 2011, the DNR referred the matter to the Attorney General to initiate legal proceedings against GPC. (See attached). The matter is currently being handled by the AG's office.

The actions taken by Director Lande and the DNR demonstrate the impartiality of Director Lande and also the commitment both he and his department have towards ensuring all environmental laws are properly followed in Iowa in order to ensure that the health, safety and welfare of Iowans are protected.

The Administration Regulation Appropriations bill will start in the Senate. The House will strike everything after the enacting clause and insert their bill. They don't plan to run two separate bills.

I don't have a spreadsheet yet, perhaps tomorrow but for sure Monday. Here's what the subcommittee discussed today:

House Republicans, Senate Democrats:

Both eliminate ODCP, transferring functions of the agency to DPH and DPS. Both would let the Efficiency Committee figure out the details which would include which FTE's to retain. They questioned whether the Governor would still appoint a Drug Policy Coordinator.

House Republicans:

Spend \$3M of Medicaid Fraud Fund to fund DIA in FY 13.....essentially restore what the Governor vetoed. They acknowledge that this is a one-time option and would do something different for FY14. Also impacts the \$2M Medicaid appropriation from the Medicaid Fraud Fund that's in the DHS bill.

Eliminate the \$3.3M I3 Distribution appropriation and spread the cost to all agencies.

2.9% ATB for all agencies represented in the committee bill.....they didn't mention any exceptions to this.

They also have issues with the language allowing **IUB to carry forward funds** remaining from FY12 into FY13 to fund unexpected expenses associated with their building project.

Take **Ethics and Campaign Disclosure** to \$475,000, then take the 2.9%

Do not support using Medicaid Fraud Fund to fund DIA

Do not shift the \$93,000 Terrace Hill funding to DAS

Dear David and Julie:

I am writing to follow up on our recent discussions regarding the Banking Division's share of the proceeds from the multi-state mortgage servicing settlement recently announced with the five largest mortgage servicers. As you know, the mortgage servicing settlement addressed mortgage practices. One of the objectives of the settlement was to address mortgage practices, including supporting and improving state financial regulation and supervision. As a result, our proposal seeks to address the Division's needs in our oversight of mortgage companies, mortgage loan originators, state chartered banks, real estate appraisers, and real estate professionals. I propose including real estate appraisers and professionals in our proposal because those industries had, and will continue to have, a role in mortgage lending. In addition, I believe better educated borrowers could have helped prevent the mortgage crises, so I am proposing we use some of the proceeds for financial literacy.

Based on our discussions, you have asked me to provide a plan for how the Division proposes to use its share of the settlement proceeds. We also agreed that because this is one-time money our plan should focus on one-time expenditures. I am attaching a spreadsheet which contains a list of one-time expenses for which we propose to use the money. You will note the total of these proposed expenditures exceeds the Division's \$1 million share of the current settlement proceeds. Our proposal is that, over the next three years, we would select from this list as we move forward and determine what actual costs for the various items we propose turn out to be. Also, because we understand there may be additional, smaller multi-state mortgage servicing settlements in the future, it is possible we will receive additional future funding.

If our proposed plan for using the settlement proceeds is acceptable to the Governor's office, legislation will be necessary to allow the Division to utilize the money in the proposed manner. To accomplish this, I am also attaching proposed legislative language to establish a multi-state settlement fund. As we discussed, if there is no legislation establishing such a fund and the settlement money is handled in accordance with our normal processes, the net result will be that the money is effectively re-distributed to the state chartered banks regulated by the Division. This was not an objective of the settlement.

If you have any questions or concerns about our proposal, please contact me or a member of my management team so that we may attempt to address them. I would appreciate feedback as soon as possible so [REDACTED] seeking legislative approval of the multi-state settlement fund if you agree with our proposal.

Draft Legislation for Multi-state Settlement Fund

Sec. X. NEW SECTION. **524.230** **Multi-state settlement fund.**

1. A multi-state settlement fund is created in the state treasury under the control of the superintendent of banking. Moneys deposited in the fund are appropriated to and shall be used by the superintendent to support state financial regulation, including but not limited to oversight of mortgage lending and mortgage servicing, real estate and real estate appraisal, state chartered banks, and other financial services regulated by the division of banking. Moneys deposited in the fund may also be used to support financial literacy efforts.

2. All moneys received by the superintendent of banking by reason of multi-state settlements with financial services providers, such as mortgage lenders, mortgage servicers, or any other person regulated by the division of banking, shall be deposited in the multi-state settlement fund.

3. Notwithstanding section 12C.7, interest or earnings on moneys deposited into the fund shall be credited to the fund.

4. Notwithstanding section 8.33, unencumbered or unobligated moneys remaining in the fund shall not revert but shall be available for expenditure for the following fiscal year.

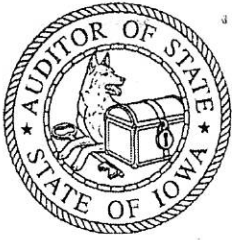

**State Auditor Vaudt: House and Senate Republican and Senate Democrat
Fiscal Year 2013 Budget Targets Lack Enough Details to Analyze**

(Des Moines, Iowa) – Continuing in his role as the “Taxpayers’ Watchdog” and his duty to report directly to the people of Iowa on the condition of the State’s finances, State Auditor David A. Vaudt has completed his review of the Fiscal Year 2013 budget targets of both the House and Senate Republicans and the Senate Democrats. Vaudt concluded it was impossible to compare the targets with Governor Branstad’s budget proposal because the budget targets lack the necessary details to fully evaluate their effects. Vaudt said, “The Governor’s complete budget report is over 1,300 pages long. The documents released by each party were just two pages—a press release and a one-page spreadsheet. Common sense would say an apples-to-apples comparison is impossible.”

Vaudt emphasized budget targets differ from budget proposals because the purpose of budget targets is not to offer specific spending proposals, but rather to set an overall spending goal—a starting point for further development. Vaudt said, “Budget targets have their uses. However, a budget target is not a spending proposal, and it is misleading to treat it as such.”

Vaudt said there is no way to tell if either set of budget targets shifts expenditures to other one-time sources—a poor budgeting practice similar to households shifting spending to their charge cards rather than reducing overall spending—without details on spending from non-General Fund sources. Vaudt said, “The Governor’s proposal details expenditures from both the State’s ‘checking account’ and the State’s ‘charge cards.’ By comparison, neither of the proposed legislative targets details the expenditures from the State’s ‘charge cards.’ An apples-to-apples comparison with the Governor’s proposal is, therefore, impossible.” Because neither of the budget targets address activity from other

funds and special accounts, it is impossible to determine if either set of budget targets spends more or less than the Governor's budget proposal for General Fund services.

From the limited information available, however, Vaudt commented on the cost reductions included in the Republican budget targets. A \$43 million spending reduction is included by requiring a \$200 monthly contribution, per employee, for health care insurance costs. Employee union contracts effective during Fiscal Year 2013 do not provide for such contributions. Since the Legislature cannot require renegotiation of employee union contracts, Vaudt questioned whether such employee contributions are actually feasible. In addition, the Republicans include a \$20 million spending reduction through "government efficiencies," which are not specifically identified. Vaudt said, "Making feasible and specific cost reduction proposals is the only way to build realizable budget targets."

Vaudt also noted a claim of the Senate Democrats' budget targets is inaccurate. Information not released with the budget targets shows the Senate Democrats use a poor budgeting practice to claim their budget targets are \$25 million below the Governor's proposal—without actually reducing spending for General Fund services. Last year's budget shifted \$106 million of cigarette and tobacco tax revenues, and the related Medicaid expenditures, out of the General Fund into the Health Care Trust Fund. The Senate Democrats propose to shift another \$113 million in this fashion. Vaudt said, "Their General Fund budget purports to spend less than the Governor, yet the level of spending for Medicaid service stays essentially the same because more money is simply moved from the General Fund and then spent out of the Health Care Trust Fund instead of the General Fund. Iowa should end this highly misleading practice by eliminating the Health Care Trust Fund and moving all Medicaid spending back into the General Fund—into the light of day." When the \$113 million is added back into the Fiscal Year 2013 General Fund budget targets, the Senate Democrats' targets actually spend \$88 million more than the Governor's budget proposal, not \$25 million less.

Branstad commission includes some hostile to Iowa judges

Republican campaign contributors dominate Gov. Terry Branstad's newest appointments to the State Judicial Nominating Commission. Big whoop. One of the benefits of being elected governor is putting like-minded people on important state boards and commissions.

Times Des Moines bureau reporter Mike Wiser requested the nominees applications under provisions of the Iowa Open Records Act. His report, published in Sunday's editions, showed at least 24 of the 30 judicial commission members have contributed to Republican causes and candidates.

Most applicants, including Judy Davidson of Bettendorf simply expressed an interest in serving: "As Scott County Republican chairwoman and proud Iowan, I would be honored to serve as a gubernatorial appointee to the 7th District Nominating Committee."

Appointee Catherine Miller-Sands of Wapello said a sense of duty compelled her service.

"The years as a regional manager with the Iowa Farm Bureau, I was asking farmers to volunteer to be involved in local and state government process. It's my time to be more involved," she wrote.

An absence of criteria

Iowans must be concerned about the other criteria — or absence of criteria — the governor used to make his selection.

Patricia Seebach of Dysarta wrote only "tbd" — shorthand for "to be determined" — when asked to provide a personal statement about her service. If Seebach hasn't determined her views on the commission and its mission, how in the world could the governor?

Leola Harris of Hopkinton offered this input for the governor to consider: "I guess I never gave it much thought to be perfectly honest with you."

Thoughtful consideration should be a minimum requirement for prospective commission members.

Another applicant, Ryan Koopmans of Des Moines has publicly supported dumping the commission system he was appointed to run.

Alice DeRycke of Belle Plaine noted her public service record: "I have been on a number of boards, some I enjoyed, some I helped dissolve."

A 'right to fire activist judges'

One applicant, Tammy Kobza, 51, used her application to disclose an agenda that seems far beyond the scope of the commission she serves: "Stopping judicial activism seems to me to be a significant way we can turn the tide of moral decay and loss of our liberties."

As president of the Iowa chapter of the conservative Eagle Forum, Kobza has condemned government at many turns. Writing for the national Eagle Forum in 2010, Kobza confessed to being “afraid of our government.”

“I see homes where lights are dim and sweltering nights are not comforted with air conditioning because some unelected agency elitists won the debate on the false science of carbon emissions. Now “power grids,” manned by some distant central planner regulate your thermostat. We are driving the one- to two-seat cars that are essentially lawn mowers on wheels.”

She’s made clear she’s targeting judges who uphold the Iowa Supreme Court’s gay marriage ruling. In a Nov. 14, 2010, letter to the Lincoln (Neb.) Journal Star, she pledged to keep up the fight.

“They’re hoping we’ll be intimidated into silence and lose the courage to exert our constitutional right to fire activist judges the next time around. But Iowans, to their credit, understand that marriage between a man and a woman is best for society. They also understand that holding activist judges accountable is a constitutional duty of self-governing people.”

So with Branstad’s blessing, Kobza now has state authority to help pick judges whose preconceived views on contemporary issues match her own.

Branstad’s bipartisan standards

We’ve commended Branstad’s effective, bipartisan ethic and savvy compromises as the essence of governance. He fell short of his usual standard by appointing some commission members with public personal, partisan agendas; others with outright hostility to the process; and some who inexplicably declined to candidly share any opinion. Absent that information, all that’s left to consider is party affiliation, which should never be the sole criteria.

Please do not present this as consistent with DHS/IME's estimate. Perhaps there was a misunderstanding. The numbers Amy shared were \$82M PRIOR to any savings from regionalization. Your highest was only \$77M, so we don't understand this number. We understand that you believe there will be no savings from regionalization, but we have no data to support that assertion at this point. Is it truly your assumption that there will be \$0 savings from regionalization? How can that be? We have requested data from UIHC to support this assertion and you have not provided any, so we don't see how you could support this at this point. We are going to need data to show that there is no savings and why because it is not going to be acceptable going forward. If you could give us more information that would show the impacts, that might be different.

Based on the lack of data, we don't have anything different to show than what we were projecting last year, which would be a savings of \$10M from regionalization. So our net estimate for UIHC is actually \$72M after you build in the regionalization, close to the appropriation. I believe Amy said that the \$77M number could be in the ballpark, prior to regionalization. But we don't agree there won't be savings from regionalization. You only need \$6M in savings to make the number work at \$77M.

As a side note you would need to identify the funding source for the state match for the \$12.5M. The IowaCare account does not have funds to support this.

PS I don't think it is a good idea for UIHC to ask legislators for a supplemental if you haven't talked with DOM or the Governor's office. They are going to expect us to be on the same page.

As you are aware, we believe the UIHC faces a shortfall in available IowaCare funding for FY 12. This belief was communicated at the HHS Appropriations Subcommittee meeting on February 9, 2012. Since that time we have reanalyzed the situation as well as have had conversations with IME regarding expectations. Our revised estimated shortfall is now \$12.5 M, which is a little more than double what was initially communicated, but is currently in line with IME's estimate.

Per the Code of Iowa, CH 249J.7(2), "Expansion population services provided to expansion population members by the publicly owned acute care teaching hospital located in a county with a population over three hundred fifty thousand and the university of Iowa hospitals and clinics shall be payable at the full benefit recipient rates." In order to honor this commitment, the Iowa General Assembly has provided supplemental appropriations in previous years. We believe another supplemental appropriation is required.

UI VP of Medical Affairs Jean Robillard and I, along with Keith Saunders, have initiated conversations with legislators regarding this FY 12 shortfall. You will undoubtedly be contacted so I wanted to give you a heads up about this. Please do not hesitate to contact Keith or me should you have any questions.

Jeff,

I'm sorry that we were unable to have lunch the other day. Your schedule must be crazy. But, I'm hoping we can reschedule that at your convenience. I'd especially like to talk about the Commissioner's position and the salary level. As you start to look for the new Commissioner, I think you and the Governor need to take a hard look at the salary level currently being paid. I think you will have a hard time finding someone with lots of experience to come to this position at the current level for which I am being paid.

In the 8 years I have been Commissioner, my salary started at \$92,000 and recently was raised to \$106,000. That's less than \$2000 a year raise. And during that time, regulation has become more complex. We have added new duties, more issues. We do more economic development outreach and have a higher profile at the national and international levels. During that time, we twice received our national financial accreditation and I served as President of the NAIC. There is more travel and the needs of our industry grown more complex and larger in scope.

Iowa maintains the 2nd largest concentration of domestic insurance carriers in the United States (after Connecticut.) We have a world class system including international companies with their north American headquarters here. Insurance is the second largest industry in the state (after agriculture) bringing in over \$119 million in revenue to the General Fund every year. (I provided you with a sheet of statistics at the meeting last week which should give you a good idea of the work in our office.)

Someone coming from industry will want a larger salary. Just for comparison, the officer manager of the Utilities Board makes more than I do. I believe I am the lowest paid financial regulator in the state of Iowa. Surrounding state commissioners in Minnesota, Wisconsin and Illinois also make considerably more. Most of my salary comes from the Examination side so it's not general fund. But, I think it's important to note the disparity. This is not a 9-5 job (if you want to do it well.) The industry is large, complex and always changing. There is much work on the weekends and quite a bit of travel-if you want to keep on top of all the issues and maintain a strong industry. Industry, agents, and the consumers expect you to be available at all times, to be on top of the national and international issues, to interact with fellow regulators around the country and abroad where our industry does business.

Jeff, this was not meant as a complaint email. But, I have been approached by several well-qualified folks about the position and they have questioned the salary. I have several times under former administrations asked [REDACTED] review. That was never really done. So, I think the time is right to have you review it. I'm happy to chat further. Just wanted to let you know my thoughts.

David, Jeff, & Julie,

We have received word that the Judge has signed the settlement agreement. According to the agreement, the banks are to make payment to the settlement trustee within seven days. The entire amount of settlement for all 50 State mortgage regulators will then be transferred to the Conference of State Bank Supervisors, who have lead the negotiations on behalf of each of the State regulators. They will hold the funds for each State until they receive a consent and authorization of when, where, and how to send the money to that State.

I propose to have them hold our settlement funds until such time that we have a consensus for approval of how to utilize our settlement. Let me know if you need any additional information, and what we need to do legislatively to establish the settlement fund to allow us to use it over a 2 to 3 year period, per the proposal we submitted and discussed.

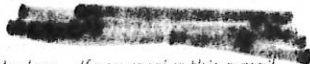

Alicia,

Last week I spoke with Jeff about a couple of issues that I would like to brief Governor Branstad (the Lt. Gov as well if you all think appropriate) related to actions by the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's offer of 2 free potassium iodide doses within a 10 mile emergency planning zone of a nuclear facility which has been accepted by Illinois, and what actions our department and Homeland Security would propose for Iowa.

The second issue is the funding reductions by CDC to the Hospital Preparedness grants and how that will alter the current regional framework that has been developed over the past decade. Thus far the department has managed this process extremely well, but I think the executive team should be made aware of the modifications and expectations of CDC. I think Governor Branstad has already received an e-mail referencing the suggestions of our bureau "Center for Disaster Operations and Response" and providing the full picture may be helpful.

Mark and I have already met briefly, and are having a more extensive meeting on May 8 with additional staff of both agencies to develop a briefing document for Governor Branstad and the executive staff.

Knowing how tight the schedule is, I thought I would arrange a meeting for Mark and I with the executive team hopefully for the week of the 14-18 of May, but not later than May 25.

Thank you very much and if you have further questions, please don't hesitate to ask. We should need about 30 minutes.

Good afternoon. Please see the attached letter, which explains the request the ICN has concerning voice communications solutions for IWD. I think it is important to understand how we got to where we are today. It is best summed up as an issue of miscommunications. The ICN has many roles that sometimes cause people to have set opinions about who we are and what we do. We are of course a State owned network, which has been upgraded at the core (the State owned part) to be considered by the FCC and other federal entities to be one of the finest in the country. That being said, the issue we are addressing here has nothing to do with that network with exception to how we use that network to provide Continuity of Government (COG) to the State. The role that we are operating within at this time is the one that was assigned to us back in 1997, which is to be the telecommunications provider to State government in Iowa. Times are certainly changing and we are moving as fast as anybody can with a system that provides service to nearly 10,000 users. We are moving to a Unified Communications and Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP) to be in place within this calendar year.

This change will give us the opportunity to reduce the cost of telephone service to our end users in the 15% area, if not more. We have also worked with some of our users within a billing arrangement where we accept upfront one-time

money (usually from some form of federal grant that an agency has received) and greatly reduce any ongoing monthly rate. I believe that it is important to recognize that the maximum savings for the State as a whole ~~has been achieved~~ with a unified solution where the number of phones served reduces the cost from the providers.

Please review the attached document where we are asking for a short time to step back and consider all of the future costs associated with fragmented ownership of agency owned solutions.

The Iowa Department of Public Health, in partnership with the Direct Care Worker Advisory Council, invites you to complete a survey about specialty trainings for direct care professionals in Iowa.

The Direct Care Workforce Initiative is a project to improve direct care professional education and ensure a qualified and stable direct care workforce in Iowa. 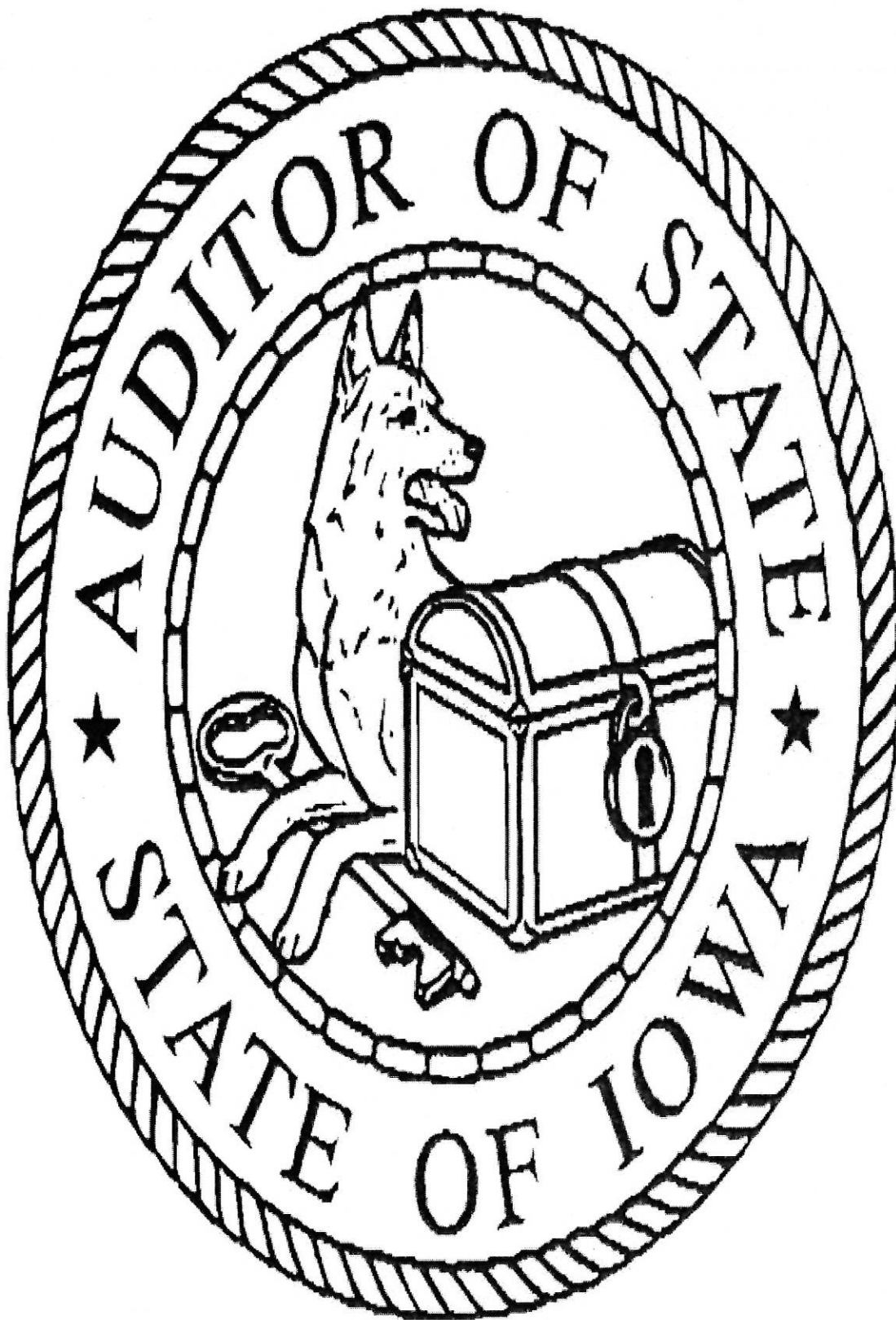

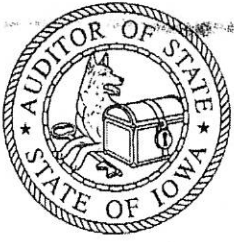

State Auditor Vaudt Reviews Final Action Fiscal Year 2013 Budget

(Des Moines, Iowa) – Continuing in his role as the “Taxpayers’ Watchdog” and fulfilling his duty to report directly to the people of Iowa on the condition of the state’s finances, State Auditor David A. Vaudt has completed his review of the Final Action Fiscal Year 2013 budget. Vaudt said, “I commend the Governor and Legislature for building on last year’s improvements in the areas of fiscal sustainability, transparency, and long-term planning.”

Final Action Budget Continues to Reduce Reliance on One-Time Monies

Auditor Vaudt has continually criticized the practice of shifting General Fund costs to one-time or limited-time monies because services are not sustainable when the one-time monies are depleted. The Fiscal Year 2011 adopted budget shifted nearly \$700 million of General Fund costs, creating a huge spending gap for Fiscal Year 2012 when many of the one-time monies were no longer available. The Fiscal Year 2012 adopted budget reduced the reliance on one-time monies by \$544 million, or 71%.

Auditor Vaudt noted the Final Action budget for Fiscal Year 2013 contains \$71 million of expenditure shifts to one-time monies, but this represents a substantial reduction in the reliance on one-time monies. Vaudt added, “The practice of shifting General Fund costs to one-time or limited-time monies has been nearly eliminated in this budget. We’re not quite where we need to be, but I am encouraged by the progress we are making.”

Improved Revenues and Fiscal Discipline Contribute to Reduced Spending Gap

The Final Action Fiscal Year 2013 budget reduces the spending gap from \$764 million in Fiscal Year 2011 to \$161 million in Fiscal Year 2013 – a 79% reduction. Vaudt said two factors led to the

dramatic, two-year reduction in the spending gap—8.8% annual revenue growth with modest, 1.7% average annual spending growth. Vaudt said, “The Final Action budget reflects a continued focus on long-term sustainability of services instead of only thinking about the next year.”

Concerns and Challenges Ahead

Vaudt noted the Final Action budget underfunds Medicaid by \$41 million. The Final Action budget also transfers \$26 million of General Fund revenues to other funds and increases reliance on one-time monies by authorizing almost \$31 million of General Fund carry forwards. Vaudt said, “These practices seriously impact year-to-year comparability.” Vaudt noted Governor Branstad also criticized the practices of underfunding Medicaid and authorizing General Fund carry forwards in this year’s bill signing statements.

Salary and benefit cost increases are not funded in the Final Action budget, which means agencies will have to absorb the increased costs. This will be the fourth consecutive year salary and benefit cost increases are unfunded. Auditor Vaudt said, “If this practice continues without offsetting agency efficiencies, these unfunded salary and benefit cost increases will significantly impact the level of service agencies can provide.”

There will be considerable pressure on revenues and spending in Fiscal Year 2014 and beyond as a result of Federal actions. Vaudt noted, “If the Federal tax code remains unchanged, Iowa will feel the impact of expired Federal income tax cuts and other scheduled policy changes, collectively referred to by the media as the ‘fiscal cliff.’ As the Federal government addresses its fiscal imbalance, Iowa can expect a decline in Federal support.”

In addition, Iowa’s primary pension system, IPERS, has seen its unfunded actuarial liability grow from \$327 million at the end of Fiscal Year 2000 to \$5.7 billion at the end of Fiscal Year 2011 – a 1,643% increase. Vaudt said, “IPERS is only 80% funded today, versus 98% funded in 2000. This is something we can’t lose sight of as we look to the future.”

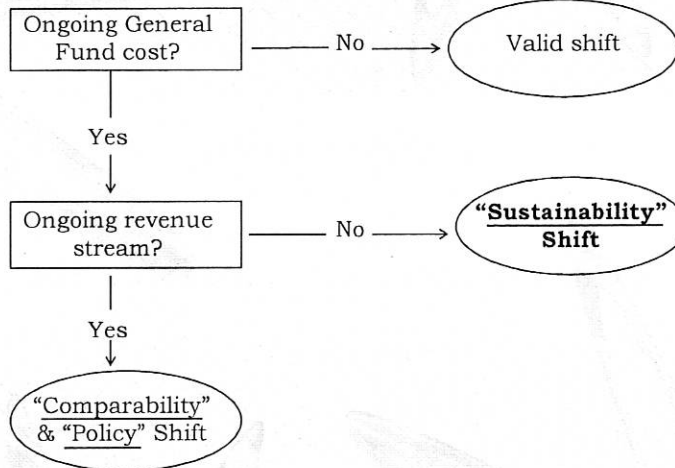

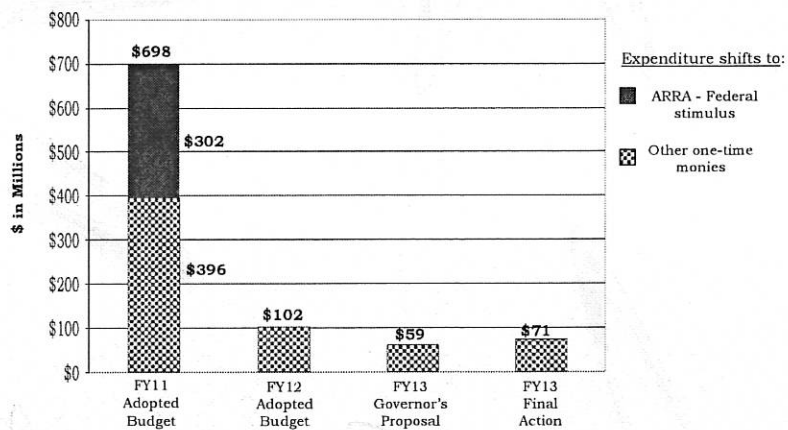
State of Iowa Expenditure Shifts

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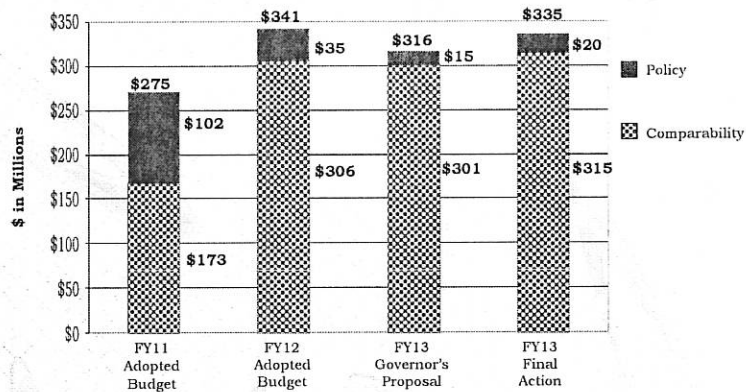
State of Iowa FY13 General Fund Budget Expenditures – Sustainability Shifts

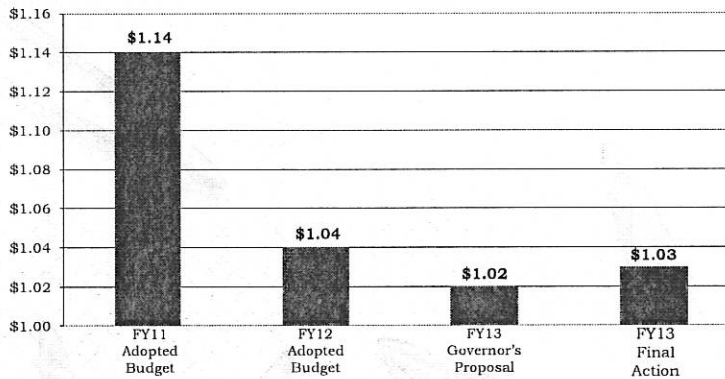

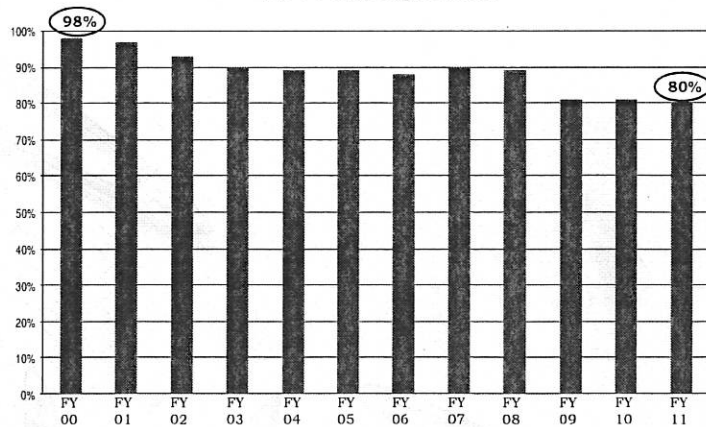

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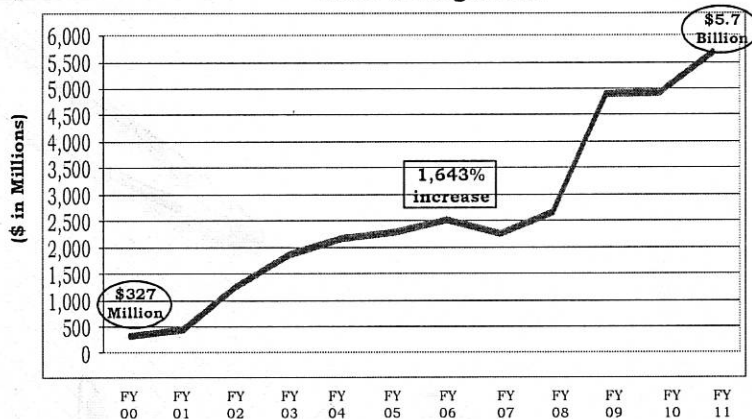

2000 through 2011



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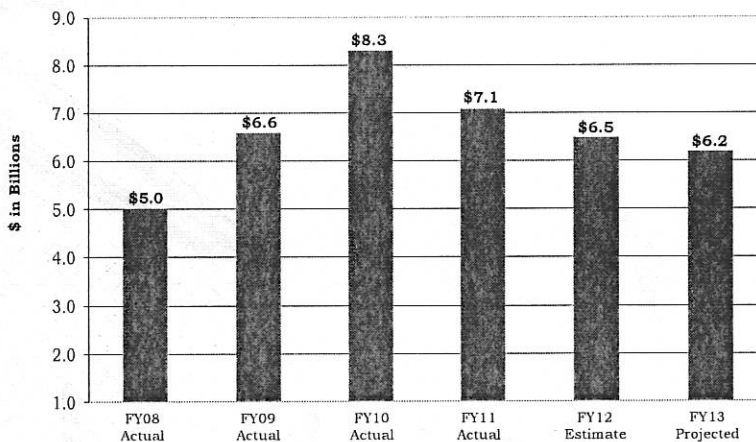

- If the Federal income tax cuts expire, it will negatively impact Iowa tax revenues for FY14.
- If Iowa elects to participate in the Medicaid expansion, it is estimated an additional 150,000 Iowans will become Medicaid eligible (current enrollment is 400,000), and the State will gradually take on 10% of the cost of these new Medicaid recipients.
