


DIA Mission

General Administration

Food and Consumer Safety

- Reduce risk of foodborne illness
 - Risk-based inspections
 - Scientific-based standards
 - Training and Education
 - Complaint investigations
 - Contract compliance monitoring
 - − 24.8 Iowans per 100,000 population − 2003
 - 27.5 Iowans per 100,000 population 2004
- Reduce risk of unsanitary conditions
 - Hotels/Motels

Social & Charitable Gambling

- Integrity of social and charitable gambling
 - Licensing of Bingo, Raffles, Games at fairs
 - Registration of Amusement Devices
 - Complaint Investigations
 - Auditing quarterly reports
 - Joint efforts with DCI, Revenue, Alcoholic Beverages Division, IRS, local law enforcement

Targeted Small Business Certification

- Create and expand Iowa Targeted Small Businesses (TSB)
 - Joint effort by DAS, DED, and DIA
 - DIA certifies eligible businesses
 - Participation in loan programs
 - State and local purchasing opportunities
 - On-line Directory available to the public

Administrative Hearings

- Provide an Administrative Due Process
 - Fair and equitable
 - Impartial ALJs
 - Timely heard
 - Based on federal or state legal requirements
 - Most by electronic means (telephone)
 - Both sides have opportunity to be heard
 - Reduced financial and time burden on the courts
 - Reduced financial and time burden on the appellants and state agencies

Health Facilities

- Safe & Quality Care for Adults & Children
 - Regular unannounced inspections
 - Health Care Facilities
 - Assisted Living Programs, Elder Group Homes, Adult Day Services Programs
 - Medicare-certified hospitals, home health agencies, hospice programs, etc.
 - Psychiatric Medical Institutions for Children
 - Foster care facilities, detention centers, etc.
 - Timely and thorough investigations of complaints, included Dependent Adult Abuse
 - Appropriate enforcement action

Abuse Coordinating Unit

- Improved process
- Consistent increase in DAA allegations in health care facilities, especially nursing facilities
 - FY02: 601
 - FY03: 925
 - FY04: 1277

- Specially-trained staff
- Respond faster to complaints
- Abusers more quickly removed from working where vulnerable Iowans live and receive care

Investigations

- Ensure public assistance resources go to only eligible persons
 - Recovery of overpayments
 - Over \$2.1 million collected in FY04
 - Fraud investigations
 - Family Investment Program
 - Food Assistance Program
 - Child Care Assistance
 - Medicaid Fraud Control Unit
 - Provider fraud investigations
 - Criminal Dependent Adult Abuse investigations
 - Divestiture

Investigations cont'd.

- Prevent harm to consumers by licensed health professionals
 - Timely provide
 information to DPH for
 them to determine if
 disciplinary action
 should be taken against
 licensed health
 professionals
- Access to care and services
 - Conduct timely audits
 - Resident trust accounts
 - State/federal financial assistance for health care facilities and residents of these facilities
 - Local DHS offices
 - \$1.8 million in FY04 reimbursed to residents or government

Employment Appeal Board

- Enhance workplace health and safety
 - Timely adjudication of Labor Commissioner Appeals
 - OSHA
 - Construction Contractor Registration
 - Alternative dispute resolution forum for citizens
 - Reduce burden on the court system
 - Reduce burden on the aggrieved parties

Child Advocacy Board

- Provide oversight of and advocacy for children in the child welfare and court systems
 - Promote permanency on a case-by-case basis
 - Protect federal funding for maintenance of children in care Foster Care Review Board Program
 - Identify barriers to permanency
 - Advocate elimination of identified barriers on a systemic level
- Two Programs
 - Court-Appointed Special Advocate Program (CASA)
 - Iowa Citizen Foster Care Review Board Program

Racing & Gaming Commission

- Integrity of pari-mutuel wagering and excursion gambling boats operations and participants
 - Facility, Operator and Occupational Licensing
 - Racing animal welfare
 - Compliance with all rules and statutes
 - Information accessible to the public

State Public Defender

- Provide fair, equitable, and timely defense services to clients
 - Constitutional mandate
 - Legal representation to eligible clients in criminal, juvenile and appellate court, and in certain civil commitment cases
 - Public Defender System
 - Contract Private Attorneys
 - Non-contract Private Attorneys

FY06 BUDGET

- Generally Status Quo
- Health Facilities
 - Increase of 3.5 FTEs to convert contract monitors for Adult Services Bureau
- Racing and Gaming
 - Increase 5 FTE to allow positions to travel between existing facilities to ensure the legality of the expanding number of slot machines and new games replacing existing games
 - Support costs
 - General Fund 100% reimbursed by the tracks and boats

Intent Language

- Food and Consumer Safety
 - Contingency language to provide funds in the event contracted food inspections is placed back with DIA
- Amusement Devices
 - Language to provide sufficient funds for DIA and DCI to administer and enforce amusement device laws under chapter 99B

Intent Language cont'd.

- Racing and Gaming
 - Contingency language to provide funding if the Commission issues new licenses and the boats become operational during FY06
 - All funding is 100% reimbursed by the boats
 - Same language as used in prior years
