• Purpose/Goal

To eliminate substance abuse, criminal behavior and addictive habits. Developing personal change by learning new ways of right living.

• Structure

Managed by peers who are dedicated to right living, accountability, and responsibility.

• Star Program (Overview)

Opened in August, 2000 Funded by a Federal Grant 70% (Byrne/Jag) 30% State match Minimum of 9 months - 46 bed capacity Orientation - 30 days Primary treatment - 6 months Preparation for return to society - 60 days

• Star Program (Content)

CCSA (criminal conduct and substance abuse)- Cognitive Behavioral Therapy to address criminal thinking and primary substance abuse issues.

Victim Impact (with victim panel)- Group designed to address the ripple effect of crime and focuses on victims and on restorative justice.

Helping Women Recover- Gender specific programming to address relationships, sexuality, spirituality, and self.

Trauma and Abuse- Gender specific programming to address trauma issues and abuse experienced by the offender.

The mission of the Iowa Department of Corrections is to: **Protect the Public, the Employees, and the Offenders** **Mind Over Mood**- Teaches offender to make changes in their mood by changing their thinking.

F.I.T. (Families in Transition)- Parenting class to address re-entry issues. Also allows staff to observe offenders interacting with their children and to offer feedback.

Individualized Treatment Plan (one on one with counselor)- I dentifies the offender's individual need areas for personalized treatment.

Power Plays- Allows offender to role-play high risk situations relating to alcohol/drug use and criminal conduct. Teaches pro-social techniques to manage them.

Women's Issues- Planned Parenthood of Iowa provides training and education on sexuality, anatomy, STD's, and high-risk behaviors.

 29 returned to prison
 15.76% return to prison rate
 20 months average time out for those who returned
