

# IowaCare Medicaid Expansion

- Current enrollment: 17,641
  - 64% of active enrollees have stayed in the program for 6 months or more.

#### IowaCare Enrollment

- Enrollment growth is statewide:
  - Polk County = 37% of total enrollment in June (from 42% in first part of the year)
  - Over the course of the year, areas outside
    Polk county have grown at a faster rate than
    the growth in Polk county.
- lowaCare provided access to care for a total of 24,884 over the course of FY 2006.

# IowaCare Expenditures

- All program expenditures will be matched by Federal funds.
- State Match of \$36.7 million
- Federal Match of \$64.1 million
- Program goal of covering IGT loss of \$65 million will be met.

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### IowaCare Claims YTD



| UIHC       | \$32.9 million               | \$37.9 million *         |
| Broadlawns | \$11.7 million               | \$37.0 million           |
| MHIs       | \$3.9 million                | <u>\$25.9 million</u>    |
| Total      | \$48.5 million **            | \$100.8 million **       |

- \* lowaCare Account funds are sufficient.
- \*\* The difference will be made up with Disproportionate Share Hospitals funds.

 Final steps in process to begin accepting cash premium payments at Broadlawns. Rules in process.


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## IowaCare Disenrollments

### IowaCare Disenrollments

- 70% of disenrolled were in the program 4 months or less
- Of those who receive disenrollment notices, 32% end up reinstated.
- Number disenrolled each month is relatively stable between 500-600.
- As enrollment grows, the <u>percent</u> disenrolled has declined over the year.

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## Health Care Reform Projects

- University of Iowa Evidence-based practice studies are complete.
- Completion of final drafts have been on hold due to the need to focus on implementing State Plan changes.
- Target to complete by end of the summer.

### Real Choices II Grant

- lowa received a federal Real Choices grant that will help support lowaCare Health Care Reform Projects.
- The goal of the federal Real Choices program is to promote member choice in long-term care.
- \$2.3 million in Federal funds
- Available beginning July 1, 2006.

- ICF/MR Case mix adjusted reimbursement methodology
- Increase the population served in HCBS
- · Electronic medical records
- Assessment of health and dental care for people with MR/DD

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## Other Real Choices Programs

- Improve web-based information and referral for long-term care and other services.
- Transportation brokerage service.
- Expand housing resources on the web.

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#### Other Medicaid Issues

- Documentation of Citizenship per the Federal Deficit Reduction Act requirements.
- CMS Demonstration to Maintain Independence and Employment Grant – \$27 million over 3 years.
  - Target population: 1,000 parolees with serious mental illness.
  - Provides medical and other supports to maintain <u>employment</u> and <u>prevent dependence</u> on SSI and other public assistance programs.
  - Partnership with Department of Corrections new transition programs and Vocational Rehabilitation.
