


#### Who are our clients?

- Indigency determined Iowa Code Sec. 815.9
  - Poverty guidelines under federal HHS rules
    - 1 person in household \$11,770
      - 125% = \$14,713
      - -200% = \$23,540
    - 4 persons in household \$24,250
      - 125% = \$30,313
      - -200% = \$48,500
  - 125% of FPL
    - <u>Entitled</u> to court appointed attorney, <u>unless</u> court finds person can pay
  - Greater than 125% of FPL up to 200% of FPL
    - <u>Not entitled</u> to court appointed attorney, <u>unless</u> court finds that not appointing counsel would cause financial hardship
  - Greater than 200% of FPL
    - Not entitled to court appointed attorney, unless charged with a felony, and court finds that not appointing counsel would cause financial hardship


- Criminal

#### **Hot Topic: Hourly Rates**

- Current rates Iowa Code Sec. 815.7
  - Class A felonies \$70/hour
  - Class B felonies \$65/hour
  - All other cases \$60/hour
- SPD report to legislature Iowa Code Sec. 13B.2A
  - Required to make recommendations regarding hourly rates
  - Did not recommend an increase
- Estimated impact of proposed \$5/hour increase
  - FY11 \$2.6M
  - FY12 \$2.7M
  - FY13 \$2.8M
  - FY14 \$2.7M

#### **Hot Topic:**

#### Minimum Qualifications Rules

- Effort to provide the highest quality legal representation to defendants
  - Requires increased experience and training in order to take on more serious cases
- Resulted in a slight decrease in the number of contract attorneys
- Effect on rural lowa
  - Some counties with very few attorneys qualified for A and B felonies
  - Reasonable enforcement and guidance to courts
  - May need to create additional flexibility in our own rules

# Hot Topic: High Billing Attorneys

- SPD identified potential abuses, reviewed and confirmed by State Auditor
  - Billing over 24 hours in a day
  - Billing for time not actually worked
    - Meetings/hearings not attended
    - Aggregating small increments of time
    - Standardized billing
  - Duplicative mileage claims
- Adopted new rules on claims
  - Maximum hours
    - No billing over 16 hours/day, limits on over 12 hours/day
  - Billing must be actual time
  - Mileage policy clarified and strengthened
- Next steps: Online claim submission

#### Hot Topic: Gideon Fellowship Update

- FY16 BUDGET REQUEST: Add 2 FTEs at an estimated cost of \$150,000
- Legislation approved authorizing the Gideon Fellowship entry-level hiring program:
  - Two-year Term Appointments
  - Enable recruiting of top law students competitively with other legal employers.
- When fully implemented, anticipate net savings of \$225,000 to total expenditures.

#### Continued Fiscal Challenges

- Lack of control over volume of criminal and juvenile court filings and limited control over cost of representation.
- Increase in Appellate Cases and Costs
- Polk County Conflict-of-Interests Removals (McKinley Interlocutory Appeal)
- Transition to Electronic Court Filing (EDMS)
- Increase in Costs of Representation in Juvenile Resentencing
- Health insurance cost increases

# Efficiency and Cost Containment Initiatives

- In Depth Review of High Billing Contract Attorneys
- Continued Development of Specially Negotiated
  Contracts for Attorneys and Nonprofit Organizations
- Lean Kaizen Event with DIA Fiscal Bureau to Improve Indigent Defense Claims Process.
- Online Indigent Defense Claim Submission System
- New Administrative Rules Regarding Claims Review Process and Contract Attorney Minimum Qualifications.

#### **Looking Ahead**

- Better use of data and technology
- Improved partnerships with private sector
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> Chair/Mentoring Program
  - Special Contracts
- Continued practical training and CLE at low or no cost
- Possible pilot project on client choice
- Better customer service
