

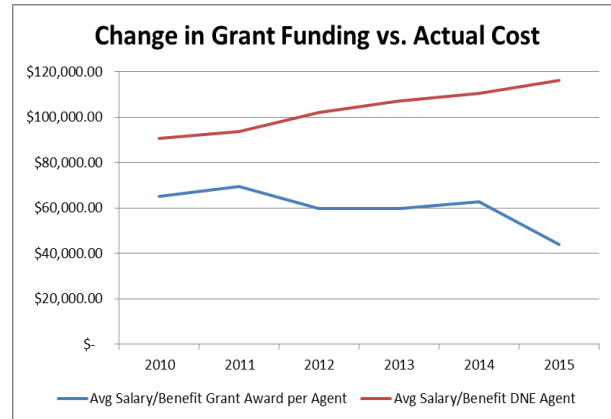
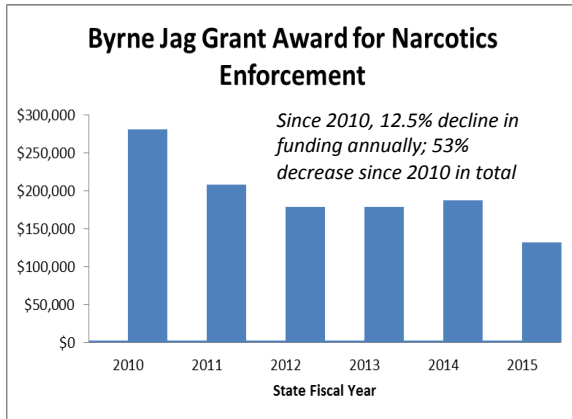


Iowa Department of Public Safety Division of Narcotics Enforcement

FY2016-2017 Budget Request:

\$396,780; 0 FTEs

To maintain 4 narcotics agents previously under grant which has been reduced over the past 6 years; These agents support local drug task forces in identifying, disrupting and dismantling major drug trafficking organizations by sharing resources (i.e. manpower, information, equipment, undercover funds); Requested funds offset salary, benefit and supply costs related to narcotics enforcement.

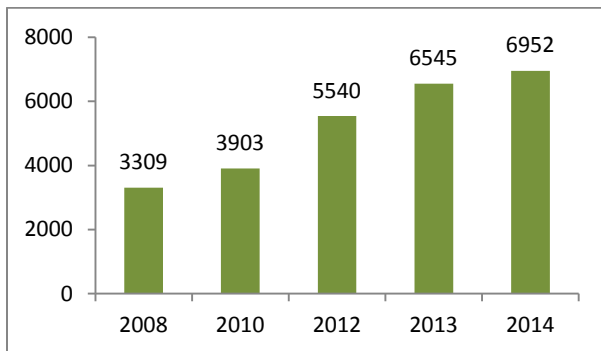
From FY2010- FY2014, the number of DNE Agents have declined 13%

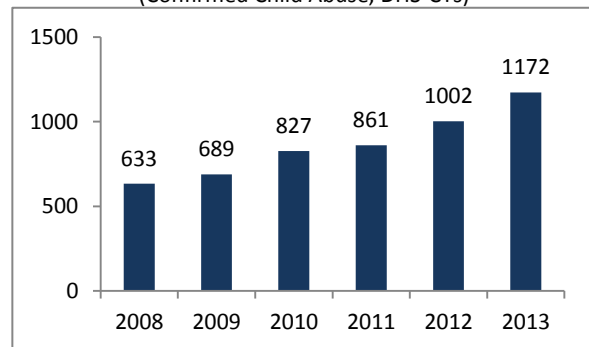
The **Narcotics Enforcement Division** serves as the lead agency in the State providing public safety through investigative enforcement of laws relating to narcotics and other controlled substances. The Division:

- targets major distributors of controlled substances
- investigates drug-related financial conspiracies, clandestine laboratories, marijuana eradication, diversion of pharmaceuticals, gang-related activities, and assistance in drug interdictions
- provides the only narcotics enforcement in some local jurisdictions
- trains state and local law enforcement agencies on drug related topics/strategies
- collects and disseminates narcotics related intelligence information for the benefit of local, state and federal law enforcement jurisdictions

- Iowa has the **6th highest** number of meth treatment admissions and **2nd highest** rate of meth treatment admissions in the US (2010 TEDS)
- There are **46.7% more** treatment admissions that occur via the criminal justice system in counties that are covered by drug task forces than those that are not (ODCP 2011)
- DNE/Task Forces have referred **1,160 drug-endangered children** to DHS over the last 3 years

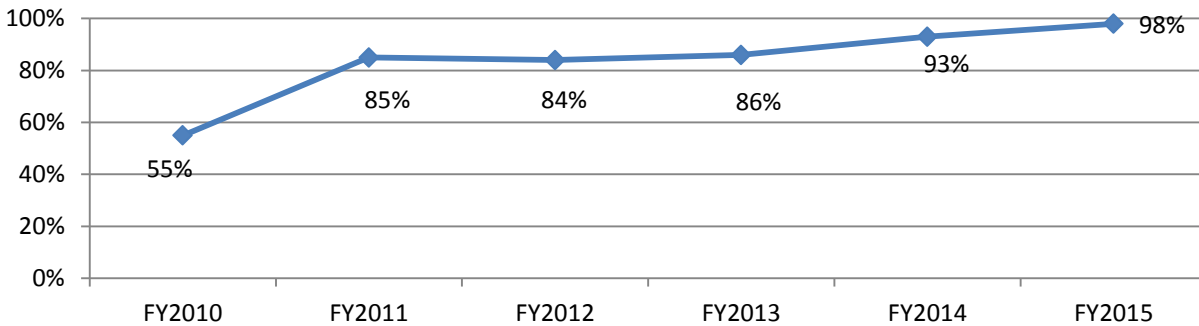

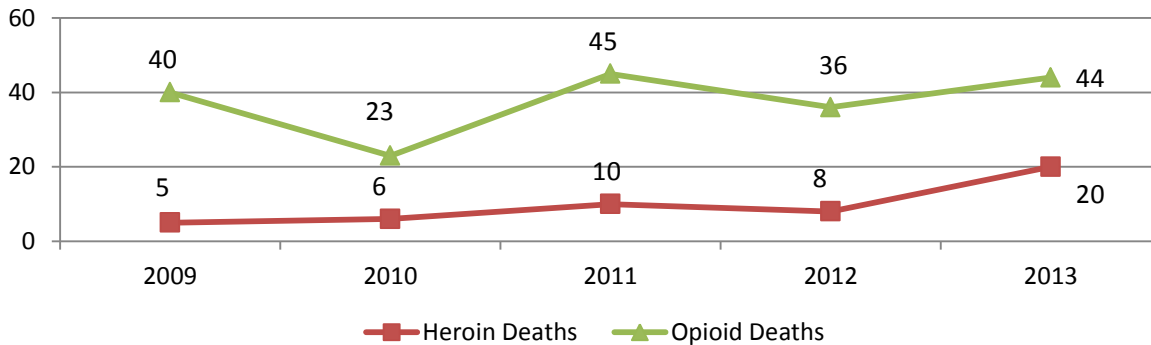
Purity Percentage of Methamphetamines
