- f. Community Colleges are Deploying \$2.5M of 260C.18A Funds Allocated to Community Colleges for This Fiscal Year for Regional Academies and Other Dual Enrollment Programs. Thank You for Helping Us Move This Strategic Initiative Forward.
- g. Make and Expand the Special Funding for 260C.18A Permanent
  - i. \$2M is Immediately at Risk and Requires Immediate Attention
  - ii. Schedule a Reliable and Permanent Fund (\$40-60M) over a Period of Years for Community Colleges to Plan and Utilize to Meet Iowa's Critical Workforce Needs
- h. Fund Our State General Aid Request for an Additional \$12.9M (Based on the Formula Adopted by the State Board of Education)
- i. Provide Community College Boards the Flexibility to Access Local Tax Support to Address Critical Workforce Shortage Issues
