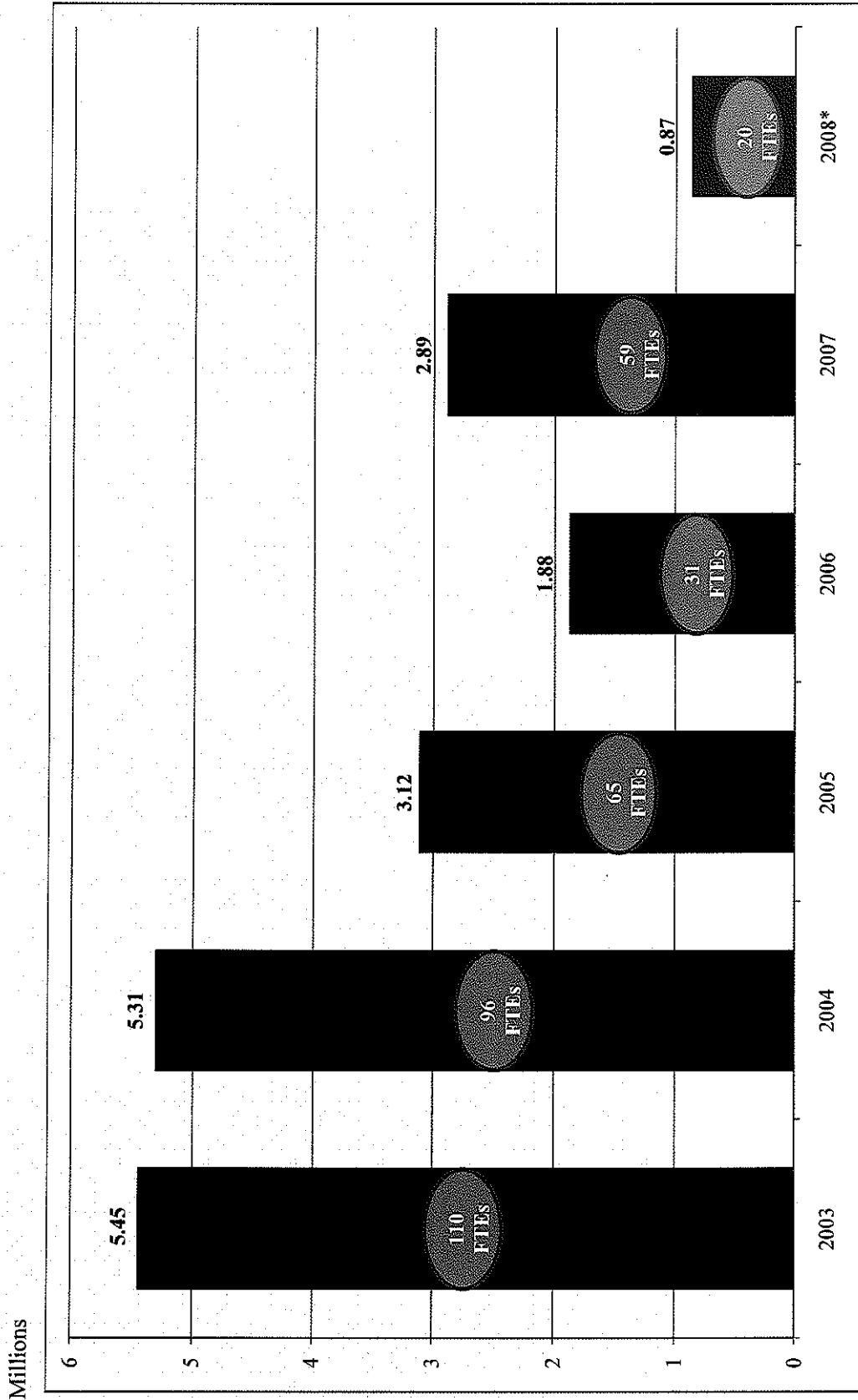

In 2005, the previous LLEBG program was consolidated with the Byrne program to create Byrne-JAG.

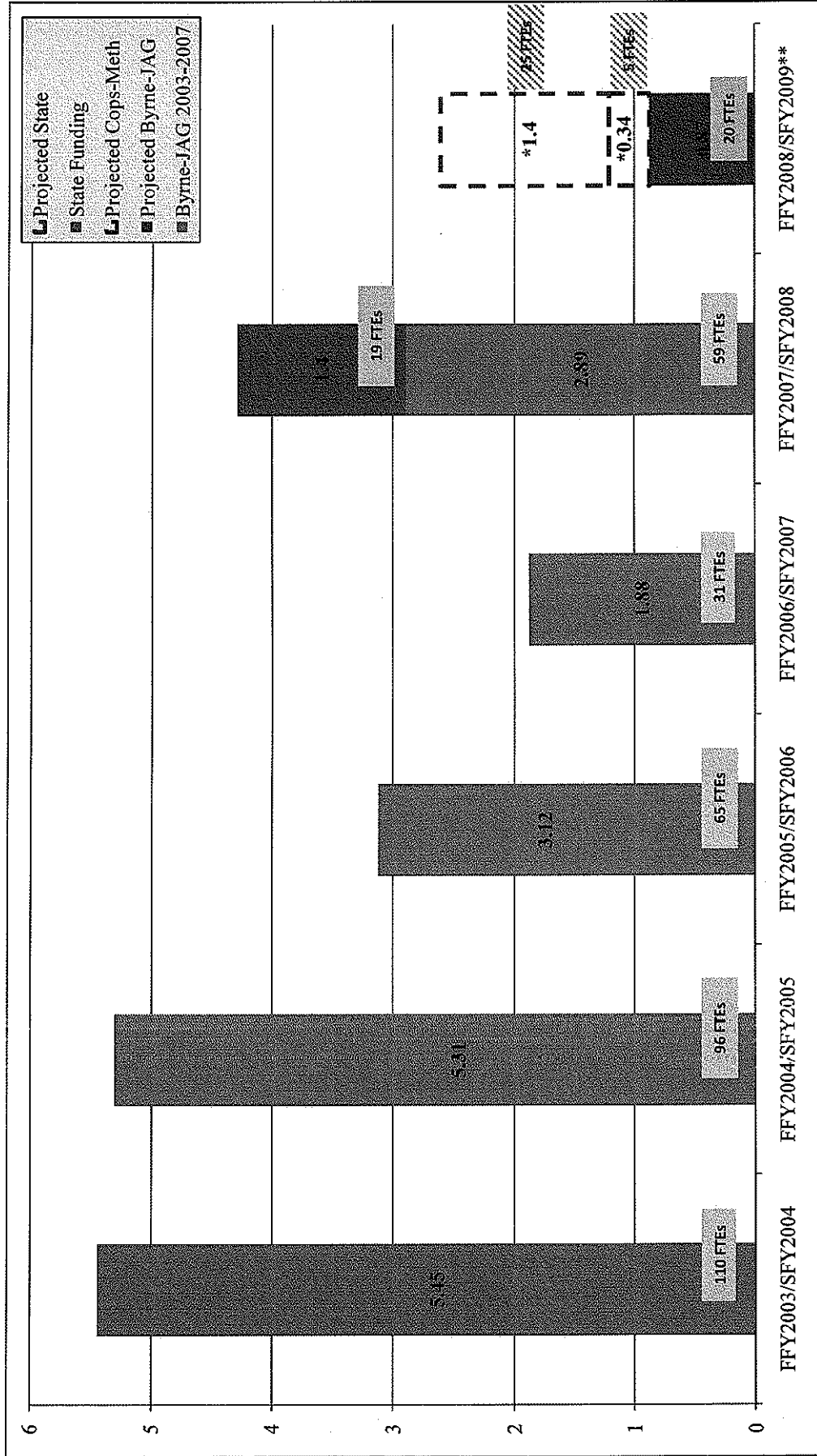
