# Iowa Law Enforcement Academy

The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy's Training Outlook supports Governor Reynolds's goals through:

## Training Outlook FY/ 2017:

❖ Peace Officers (Basic Schools/Specialty Schools):	9,938
❖ Reserve Officers:	72
❖ Jail Personnel:	1,042
❖ Telecommunicators:	121

- ❖ Developed and implemented a manual containing policies and procedures for the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy staff.
- ❖ Completed and implemented the automated scheduling calendar for all Basic Academy training and all Specialty school training

- ❖ Currently completing the scanning and conversion of paper files to electronic filing system for:

- ❖ The Iowa Law Enforcement Academy expanded training in the area of Human Trafficking. Through funding by the Attorney General's Office, Human Trafficking expanded by providing a series of "Train the Trainer" sessions. Held throughout the year to area law enforcement and other provider groups. As the emphasis for Human Trafficking moves forward, development of investigative techniques for street officers and investigators will occur in the upcoming year.
- ❖ Increased programming in domestic abuse through the use of Scenario based training
- ❖ Crisis Intervention Training (CIT); all Basic Academy students currently receive Crisis Intervention Training and additional mental health training. (27 total number of training program hours)

## Goals Achieved FY/2017

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- ❖ Train over 10,000 Law Enforcement Personnel
- ❖ Incorporate Merit System procedural language into current Iowa Law Enforcement Academy policies.
- ❖ Domestic Violence goals are to educate and train Iowa officers using a victim-centered methodology for victim-based crimes to lessen additional trauma within the criminal justice system.
- ❖ Create Community Outreach Instructor position
  - Blue Courage/Officer Resilience
  - Crisis Intervention/Mental Health Training
  - Community Outreach/Executive Leadership Training
  - Cyber Crimes/Training
  - Technology Training/Computer Training
- ❖ Create options for consideration regarding the Iowa Law Enforcement Academy building.
