

Collaboration is Key

- Fostering collaborative working relationships with the Department of Corrections and other stakeholders in the criminal justice system
 - Open communication increases efficiency at all stages of the release decision making process
 - Elimination of unnecessary administrative review steps results in greater fiscal responsibility
 - Collaboration across disciplines results in enhanced offender reentry planning and more comprehensive reviews

What the Future Holds

- Development of ICON Commutation and Clemency Module
 - Will allow digital submission, management, transmission, and storage of applications
- Digitization of existing paper offender files
 - Approximately 11,300 files must still be digitized and entered into ICON
 - · Digitization will increase efficiency and ultimately reduced storage burden
