

REPORT OF THE STUDIES COMMITTEE OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL

July 26, 1971

The Studies Committee of the Legislative Council recommends that the following study committees be authorized as major studies with a reporting date to the General Assembly of January 1, 1973.

1. SCR 25--A study creating a Department of Transportation.
2. SCRs 39 and 45--A study relating to elementary and secondary school systems and the statutory educational standards.
3. HCR 9--A master plan for higher education.
4. HCR 22--A study of the penal and correctional system in Iowa.
5. HCR 25--The development of land use policies.

The following study committees were authorized with a reporting date of January 1, 1972.

1. SCR 28--Bank holding companies.
2. HCR 48--Eligibility standards of categorical assistance grant programs.

In addition the Studies Committee recommends the carrying out of the study provided for in Senate File 565, relating to the present and future roles and adequacy of the mental health institutes and the existing institutions for juveniles under the Department of Social Services.

The Studies Committee recommends the completion of the Criminal Code Study Committee.

The Studies Committee previously recommended a study of the State Commerce Commission. In addition the Studies Committee recommends the referral of SCRs 22 and 31 be carried out by the appropriate standing committees. It also recommends that HCRs 34, 45, and 46 be carried out by the appropriate standing committees.

REPORT OF THE BUDGET COMMITTEE REGARDING BUDGET

LEGISLATIVE SERVICE BUREAU FOR FISCAL YEAR 1971-1972

1. The salary of the Director be set at \$20,000.00.
2. The salaries of the secretarial staff as recommended for July 1, 1971 be reduced for each position by the amount recommended for January 1, 1972 increments, however each member of the secretarial staff shall be paid the increment recommended for January 1, 1972.
