

**REPORT OF THE STUDIES COMMITTEE
OF THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL**

July 8, 1987

The Studies Committee of the Legislative Council met on July 8, 1987 to consider additional studies and other material relating to studies coming before the Committee and makes the following recommendations:

1. That the following committees be established as follows:

a. Review of State Services for Older Iowans

5 Senators, 5 Representatives
3 Meetings

b. State Tax Reform

2 Senators appointed by Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate; 2 Representatives appointed by the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House; 8 public members, 2 appointed by each of the Leaders; and 1 public member to chair the Committee to be selected with agreement of all Leaders.
5 Meetings

c. Health Care Services

5 Senators, 5 Representatives, 5 Public Members
4 Meetings

d. AIDS Task Force

2 Senators, 2 Representatives, 7 Public Members selected from health care professionals, insurance representatives, and representatives of affected groups
2-year study, with 3 meetings approved for development of the study plan

e. Public Funds for Economic Development

5 Senators, 5 Representatives
3 Meetings

f. Infrastructure Funding Formula

5 Senators, 5 Representatives, 5 Public Members
3 Meetings

- g. Court Administrative Services
 - 5 Senators, 5 Representatives
 - 2 Meetings
- h. Outdoor Recreation Funding
 - 5 Senators, 5 Representatives
 - 3 Meetings
- i. Employee Assistance Program
 - 3 Senators, 3 Representatives
 - 2 Meetings
- j. Community College Capitals Funding
 - 3 Senators, 3 Representatives
 - 2 meetings

2. That the following LEAG study be authorized:

a. Mandated Insurance Coverage

Document the status and impact of legislatively mandated life and health coverages in other states, and study the regulatory practices covering benevolent associations and organizations with a report to be submitted by November 1, 1987

3. That the following issues be referred to the Fiscal Committee:

- a. Issue of government competition with private enterprise
- b. Prison population review, including issue of privatization
