More than 94% of all judicial officers participated in the study during which they kept detailed records of the amount of time they spent on case-related work (by the 23 case types above), noncase-related administrative duties, and travel.

**Complex civil cases, for purposes of the case weights, include: medical/dental malpractice, product liability/toxic substance cases, other professional malpractice, and “other contract/commercial cases” identified by the judges as complex during the study period.

IOWA JUDICIAL BRANCH COURT COLLECTION PROCESSES

The Judicial Branch uses various tools to collect debt owed to the clerks of court for fines, fees, court costs, restitution, and other debt owed to the court. These tools are described below:

Clerks' Noticing – Clerks of court typically mail to debtors at least two reminder notices. The first notice is the judgment entry or sentencing order, and is mailed at the time the fee is imposed if payment has not been made. The second notice is mailed if payment is not received within 20 days. If payment is not received within ten days of the second notice, the account will be transferred to the Iowa Department of Revenue and Finance (DRF) for collection.

C.C.U (Centralized Collection Unit) – A primary collection tool is the Court Collections Interface Project with the Department of Revenue and Finance (DRF) and their Centralized Collection Unit (CCU). The CCU process involves a computer interface between the clerks of court and DRF. The interface allows the clerk to send case information to DRF electronically. Debtors are charged a 10% fee when their case is transferred to DRF for processing. DRF uses a variety of collection methods, including letters and phone calls. They have state of the art technology for collections and use an outside agency that specializes in debt collections to help with this process.

Income Tax, Vendor Offset, & Lottery Winnings – In addition to transferring information to the Centralized Collection Unit of DRF, we also transfer court debt to the Department of Administrative Services (DAS) for state income tax offset, vendor offset, and lottery winnings.

Treasurer's Interface Project – The Treasurer's Interface Project was established for the purpose of preventing individuals who owe delinquent debt to the State of Iowa from renewing their vehicle registrations. Each evening through the use of ICIS technology, a comprehensive list of those persons who owe delinquent debt to the clerks of court is transmitted to the Department of Transportation (DOT). The DOT posts this information so county treasurer's can refuse renewal of vehicle registration for those persons on this list.

Iowa Conviction Notification Network (ICONN) – The ICONN Interface Project was established for the purpose of preventing individuals who owe delinquent debt to the State of Iowa for traffic citations from renewing their driver's license. Through the use of ICIS technology, the Department of Transportation is notified electronically each day of the persons who have been convicted of violating a law regulating the operation of a motor vehicle and have failed to pay the criminal fine, penalty, surcharge, or court cost. The DOT suspends the person's driver's license until the fine, penalty, surcharge, or court costs are paid.

County Attorney Collections – Iowa Code section 602.8107(4) allows a county attorney to collect delinquent court debt and receive 40% of amounts collected. Forty-five county attorneys are active in the collection process.

Judges and Magistrates – Judges and magistrates continue to be active in collections. With the help of the clerks of court and ICIS, judges and magistrates monitor payments. In many counties if a fine is not paid timely, defendants are required to attend show cause hearings and explain to the judge why payment has not been made. Requiring defendants to come back to court if a fine is not paid is a good incentive and reminder that their fine needs to be paid.

JUDICIAL BRANCH INTERFACES

CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION NETWORK (CJIN) – Judges application that combines ICIS data with Department of Correction (DOC) probation data, Department of Transportation (DOT) drivers license and vehicle registration information, and DPS warrant and criminal history data

CENTRAL COLLECTIONS UNIT (CCU) – cases with delinquent debt are sent to CCU so Department of Revenue and Finance (DRF) can attempt to collect

INCOME TAX OFFSET (DRF) – Data on delinquent court debt is provided to DRF for review against tax returns. Matches result in reduction of tax returns by the amount of the debt owed. Debt collected is returned to the court

TREASURER'S INTERFACE – Delinquent court debt data is provided for the Treasurer's Offices. The Treasurer's check the delinquent debt list prior to issuing license plate renewals. Once the delinquent debt is paid the Treasurer's issue the renewals.

COC2CSRU (Clerk of Court/Child Support Recovery Unit) – Shared interface between Department of Human Service (DHS) Child Support Recovery Unit (CSRU) and clerks of court for child support payments

IV-D CHILD SUPPORT REPORT (DHS) – The court captures time spent on IV-D cases electronically and provides quarterly to DHS for federal reimbursement for work done by the clerks of court.

WELFARE REFORM - SCR/SDU (DHS) – Data is provided by the court for the State Case Registry and State Disbursement Unit for the purpose of automatically taking child support from participating employers for their employees and sending the child support to the recipient.

CRIMINAL CASE HISTORY (CCH) – dispositions on criminal charges are provided to the Department of Public Safety (DPS)

DEFERRED JUDGMENT (DPS) – Deferred judgment data is transmitted to DPS for addition to the criminal case history

DOMESTIC ABUSE (DPS) – Domestic abuse information (e.g. no contact orders, protection orders) is sent to DPS for the Iowa System for Law Enforcement officers

ECCO (DOT/DPS/Law Enforcement) – Users of the Traffic and Criminal Software (T1aCs) provided by DOT electronically transmit ticket data to the court

ICONN (DOT) – Data is provided by the court to DOT on traffic citations for suspension for non-payment, withdrawals for those paid after a suspension notice, and conviction information

ELECTRONIC PRE-SENTENCE INVESTIGATION REPORT (E-PSI) – A request by the court for a pre-sentence investigation report is transmitted to DOC. DOC compiles the report and returns the report electronically to the court. Judges and attorneys of record can review the reports online (currently only in Districts 3 & 6)

GARNISHMENT - Praecipe Report (Legislative Fiscal Office) – Praecipe report is provided monthly to the Legislative Fiscal Office

JUSTICE DATA WAREHOUSE - JDW (CJJP/ITE) – Specific data on criminal and juvenile cases is transmitted to the JDW for use by the Department of Human Rights (DHR). DHR provides reporting for various judicial, executive and legislative branch personnel as requested

JURY SELECTION INFO (DOT/SEC OF STATE) – DOT and SOS provide information to the court for use in compiling juror selection data for each county on a yearly basis.

OFFICE OF AUDITOR OF STATE (AOS) – The court provides data to the Auditor for the purpose of yearly auditing county clerks of court

TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS - TPR - Juvenile Report (DHS) – Data is provided by the court to DHS monthly on those cases that involve the termination of parental rights.
